There if you need them ... Will YOU be there for them?

WE BARELY EVEN NOTICE it any more. It's no longer even news. Just turn on your radio or television, or read the newspaper, and the recent 'Economic Downturn' is the big global story these days.

With "the economy" being blamed for cut-backs, job losses, diminished buying power and a consumer credit crunch, the average North American family is under more and more pressure to make ends meet.

For others, it's even more serious and much closer to home. For them, it's not about statistics, free trade, wage parity or job sharing: it's about just getting through each day.

Government Social Service bureaus, responsible for such important issues as Welfare, Mothers' Allowance, Services for the Disabled and the Homeless, do their best with their discretionary funds, on a community level. But these discretionary funds are stretched thin, and can't be counted on to help everyone in need.

It's the community itself that needs to look after their own. Indeed, some would say that it's what defines a community in the first place.

Anna Hamilton, Chair of the St. Joseph Island and Area Food Bank and Community Kitchens, knows this only too well. "It's about neighbours helping neighbours. We're just helping to organize the effort and focus it where it's most needed."

The Island and the North Shore communities have always been generous in their efforts to provide relief to those in need, especially among the various Church groups in the area. Today's Food Bank organization grew out of this 'grass roots' concern, when the United Church Outreach Committee applied to the local Social Service bureau in Thessalon for funding. The funding was granted in November 2001, and the Food Bank as we know it today, was born.

"There is no monopoly on sharing" says Anna. "I can't begin to tell you about all the tremendous support we receive, both in material and money, from a wide variety of sources. Many individuals and families have been most generous. In

Question: I have Sympatico dial-up Internet. Last week Sympatico refused to connect for two days. During this time I called Sympatico technical support where I was told that my modem was causing the problem. Then, on the third day everything was working again. Please explain what happened. Do I need a new modem?

Answer: Your unpleasant experience was shared by dozens of Sympatico dial-up customers in our small community, as well as in Desbarats and Echo Bay. Contrary to what the technical support implied, this recent outage was an undiscovered problem with a Sympatico Internet server. That's their end, not your end! Evidently the front-line technical support was not informed. Most call centre personnel follow a script when diagnosing customer Internet issues. This requires virtually no technical expertise on the support side and ties up frustrated Sympatico customers in a plodding step-by-step session lasting hours. If you hang up and call back with the hope of acquiring a more experienced techie, you will be forced into answering the same scripted questions. A better option for Sympatico dial-up customers is contacting local neighbours and friends using the same Sympatico dial-up Internet service.

Whenever Sympatico dial-up suffers a system-wide outage, dozens of customers are affected. Confirming this fact, do not be content with front-line technical support. Politely avoid being drawn into a scripted hour-long question and answer session. Be firm. Ask for a technical supervisor and report your problem. Then, sit back and wait. Encourage anyone else suffering a similar woe to call Sympatico. A flood of identical complaints will surely awaken the sleeping beast. Sympatico system-wide errors are eventually detected and corrected over-night. Allowing uninformed front-line technical support an opportunity to muck up your computer and to convince you to buy a new modem is unacceptable. Here's some good news for all you dial-up Internet users. Bell has been quietly extending the range for DSL (Digital Subscriber Line) high-speed Internet service beyond Richards Landing. Call 310-8400 and speak to a Bell sales representative about availability in your area. Unsatisfied with dial-up service with no DSL in your near future, there's always satellite Internet service. Xplornet service is beamed into our region from a Hughes satellite. From what I have seen, performance is better than via older Anik satellite but slower than DSL. Let's go surfing now!

Is one life lost worth the \$200,000 saving?

It is our understanding that a consulting company hired by Sault Area Hospital (SAH) to address the current outstanding deficit of over \$13 million will submit their finished report to the SAH Board sometime in early 2009.

We have been informed that a recommendation to reduce the hours of emergency room service at Matthews Memorial Hospital (MMH) may be made.

This possibility is of grave concern to our organization. It is our view that the 24-hour emergency care presently provided at the MMH site is the minimum standard acceptable to residents of this area.

MMH serves communities on the North Shore from Echo Bay to Bruce Mines and all of St. Joseph Island. The tax-paying residents of these ten townships in rural Northeastern Ontario will not accept the elimination of emergency room services, the reduction in community health care services, and risk of lives lost. Is one life lost worth the \$200,000 annual saving this elimination of service will provide for the SAH budget?

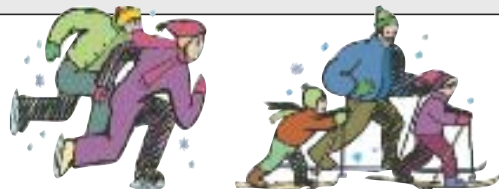

Dear Madam,

I regret very much the delay in answering your letter, but I now take the pleasure of informing you that a B.C. is located nine miles north of our camping ground, and is capable of seating 250 people at one time.

I admit that it is quite a distance away if you are in the habit of going regularly but no doubt you will be pleased to know that a great number of campers go there and many take their lunches along and make a day of it. They usually arrive nice and early and stay quite late.

The last time my wife and I went was six years ago, and it was so crowded we had to stand up the whole time we were there. It may interest you to know that there is a special supper planned there to raise money to buy more seats so that everyone will be able to sit in comfort.

I would like to say that it pains me very much not to be able to go more regularly, but it is surely no lack of desire on my part, just that I am so busy most of the time.

As we grow older, it seems to be more of an effort to go, especially in the cold weather. If you decide to come down to our camping ground perhaps I could go with you the first time you go, sit with you and introduce you to all the other folks.

Remember this is a very friendly community.

addition, organizations and churches have been especially supportive. The Anglican Parishes of St. Joseph and St. George, for example, have held a number of very successful food drives. For the past 3 years, the Northern Credit Union branch in Richards Landing have been fantastic boosters, through their "pennies" programme. Sally Hooke and Jocelyn Township have been outstanding in their support, through the 'Jocelyn Mall's' contributions".

"We do receive some funding from the Service Bureau, but most of our support and help comes from the community. All these wonderful people and organizations are truly a blessing".

Anna and her team of fellow dedicated volunteers co-ordinate two principal programmes:

The Food Bank is open Wednesdays, from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm, at Harmony St. Mark's United Church in Richards Landing. The number of families using this service varies widely: "We've had up to 21 families, which represented 70 people ...approximately half of them children"!

On average, the Food Bank helps 10 to 12 families per week. Each family receives a standard shopping bag of food, with no questions asked. Presently the Food Bank must limit its help to two visits a month per family. In Anna's words, "We're doing the best we can with what we've got. We'd like to do more, because the need is for more".

The second initiative is '**Community Kitchens**', a unique programme of 'shared cooking', through which participants pay a nominal fee to prepare meals together, which are then shared amongst the participants, who then take the meals home. The food, cooking utensils and facilities are provided for their use.

There are presently 2 'Community Kitchens' operating in the area. "It's a wonderful way to ensure quality, healthy meals, plus it gives participants the benefit of having others with whom to socialize".

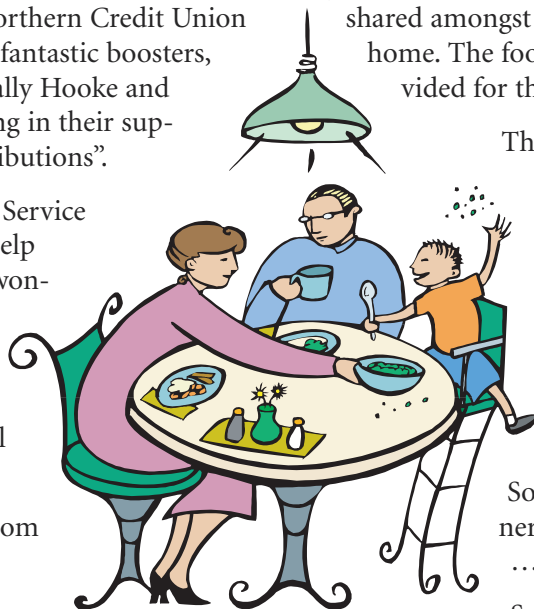
The Food Bank and Community Kitchens have come a long way in the past 8 years, and sadly, there's still a long way yet to go.

So tonight, when you sit down at your dinner table, don't just count your blessings share them!
