what kind of opportunity – and challenges – it presented, and what the right people could do with it.

They came back to the Island in late April to investigate further, and they liked what they saw. Although it was a big risk for them, they didn't hesitate. By the last week in April, they had sealed the deal, and by the second week in June, only a few short weeks later, they were opening the doors of the Lighthouse Grill to the waiting public!

"We didn't have time for complete renovations," smiles Emily. "We talked with the previous owners and bought some of their materials and equipment, and we did extensive décor changes, such as painting, re-covering the tables, opening up the bar area, and such."

Although they weren't yet officially open on May 30th, the day of the dedication ceremonies of Richards Landing's new lighthouse, Emily and Todd moved a grill outside, to provide food and warmth to shivering attendees. "We wanted to meet the community and let them see us too," explains Emily. "We didn't want to be strangers, when we did open."

"Our vision is to offer 'something special' – a change-up from the usual fare you'd expect at average restaurants," says Todd. "Growing up in the Soo, I was a very plain eater. Then I went away to College & Cooking School and my eyes were opened to so many new things! When someone goes out to dine, they're not going to ask for the same things they can eat at home," he smiles. "I like to try new ingredients and different combinations. I try to make even simple food more unique and exciting ... a little bit different than what 'the other guy' would do."

Emily adds "But we also cater to what our diners want. We have some very interesting pasta dishes, and we know that we HAVE to have whitefish on our menu! Everyone raves about our deep fried whitefish!" she beams.

Emily and Todd have a clear vision of what they want the Lighthouse Grill to be. "We want to keep it a small, intimate place, seating about 40 people inside, and maybe up to 100 people in the summer time, when the patio is open. We're not catering so much to the late hours bar crowd. We're first and foremost a restaurant," she states definitively.

That's not to say that the Lighthouse Grill is for snobs only. Todd elaborates "Our idea is to offer something for people wanting to come for a special occasion, such as an Anniversary dinner. Our 'regulars' are a mature clientele who like to dress up a little, to dine in style or if you're casual you will fit in as well. People don't see us as a 'burgers and chicken wings' kind of place. If you want a \$10 meal, you can have that. If you want a \$30 meal, you can have that too. Whatever our customers want, we'll do! We try to suit all tastes."

"We get everybody here. A group of business people could be sitting across from dressed up, hat and gloved ladies, who



could be sitting next to younger guys in shorts and tee shirts, and nobody feels uncomfortable or out of place. We're happy to see families and we accommodate children. Even our own kids sometimes come to eat here!" chuckles Emily.

The bigger challenge for the Tremblays right now is to make it all work. In addition to commuting to and from the Soo for a demanding 14 or 16 hour workday, they must also balance the needs of their children and family. "Grandma and Poppa' have been a true blessing for us through all of this!" sighs Emily thankfully.

And their Hotel and Restaurant management backgrounds are showing. "It's all come in so handy for us now that we're putting it into practice – especially our standards of cleanliness." says Emily. "Customers quickly approve or disapprove of a restaurant, based on how clean it is – especially in the washrooms! That's one thing we hear often – it's so clean!

Todd chimes in, "In cooking school I was taught that the two first things that ANY good restaurant must have, are clean bathrooms and good soup!" he smiles.

"We're very happy with how things are going, and our customers are already asking about our plans for the winter season." Emily tells us. "We plan to be open year round. Maybe we'll do some special features over the winter, such as cooking classes or demonstrations, Sunday brunches, and the like. The response so far has been great!"

And then the obvious question: are they thinking of moving to the Island? "That came up on the very first day, and everybody asks us that!" chuckles Todd. "Right now, with two little ones in the Soo, and relying so much on Grandma and Poppa, we're kind of locked in for at least the near future. But who knows what might come up in the future" he says, with a 'Cheshire Cat' smile.

Coming soon The 75th Anniversary Plowing Match!

IN JULY OF 1934, a meeting of interested St. Joe farmers was held for the purpose of organizing a Plowmen's Association. And so, 75 years ago, the St. Joseph Island Plowmen's Association was born, with 51 Members. The first Plowing Match, among 20 men with teams of horses and walking plows, took place on October 5th, 1934.

Today, of all the Plowing Associations formed in Algoma in 1934, only the St. Joseph Island Plowmen's Association remains active.

"St. Joseph Island is rich in history and that includes the St. Joseph Island Plowmen's Association," said Association President, Perry Coulter. "It's hoped the weather cooperates and that folks from near and far come out and take part in the celebration."

After months of planning, the St. Joseph Island Plowmen's Association, along with the Association's Anniversary Committee, is pleased to announce that this year's 75th Annual St. Joseph Island Plowmen's Association Plowing Match will be held on August 22nd, on the very grounds where its rich history began – the St. Joseph Township Centennial Grounds!

On August 22nd, past and present members of the Plowmen's Association, from all corners of St. Joseph Island, Sault Ste. Marie and beyond, will converge at the corner of the D Line and 10th Side Road, with tractors and plows, for the 9 am traditional drawing of the lands.

Anyone interested in entering the competition should be on the field before 9 am.

In addition to the Annual Plowing Match, there will be added attractions for all ages, including demonstrations, exhibits, kids' games, food & snacks, as well as a Silent Auction.

4-6 lean pork loin chops, 3/4-1" thick

1 box Stove Top Cornbread Stuffing Mix.

QUESTION: My computer is slow, locks up frequently, and makes a loud clicking sound. This computer was purchased more than 5 years ago. Have you any idea what could be wrong?

ANSWER: Judging from the symptoms, the clicking sound, and the age of your computer, the hard drive should be replaced immediately. Often referred to as the Click of Death, this sound might be over-looked if your computer is enclosed or buried under a desk. If you have not backed up your documents, photos, and other essentials, do back everything up soonest. There is no guarantee that your hard drive will even spin up next time you try to use it. A reliable computer simply wears out components over time. We think nothing of replacing worn automotive parts. Computers also have wear items such as hard drives, power supplies, cooling fans, and CD/DVD drives. Replacing a worn hard drive costs much less than reinvesting in a new computer system by a long shot. How can you recognize the Click of Death? Google the following keywords: failing hard drive sounds. This should take you to www.datacent.com/hard_drive_sounds.php. Click on any

play button to hear distressing audio samples from failing hard drives. A veritable symphony!

QUESTION: Recently my computer refuses to turn on. I have to press the power button several times, wait, and try again to get it to start. Also, while I am using the computer, it kicks me out and restarts all on its own. What's wrong?

ANSWER: Let me hazard a guess: power supply. A failing power supply will cause intermittent symptoms such as refusing to turn on and spontaneous rebooting. Eventually, the computer will not turn on at all. While your computer is still running, touch the top of the computer case. Is it hot? Can you hear the power supply cooling fan? Using a flash light, peek into the rear circular venting. Are the fan blades moving? Are the blades dusty and are the vents clogged with dust bunnies? A seized cooling fan and prolonged over-heating are reasons for replacing a computer power supply. Even a reliable computer will wear out a power supply occasionally. Replacing a defective power supply with a fresh 350 – 500 Watt power supply gives that home or work computer a second chance.

New "Infrastructure Stimulus Fund" Announced
