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## Hamilton Fire Department to the Rescue!

### That's right ... The HAMILTON Fire Department!

THIS SPRING, the Jocelyn Fire Department realized that their tanker truck was in need of more repair and that it was probably not worth spending more money on the old truck.

Thankfully, Jocelyn had backup for tanker services from the other fire departments on the island, but being a rural department, having a tanker readily available is very important.

I mentioned our problem to my nephew on the Hamilton Fire Department, who in turn put Hamilton's Deputy Chief, Jim Doyle in touch with Jocelyn's Deputy Chief. After learning of Jocelyn's situation, Mr. Doyle said he would talk to the Chief Mechanical Officer, Bob Kay, and be back in touch.

Almost immediately, Mr. Doyle called back and informed Jocelyn that there was a tanker coming out of service from one of the volunteer departments which would be a good truck for the department. Hamilton's normal procedure was to send the truck out to auction, but understanding Jocelyn's urgent need and Hamilton's desire to help a fellow department, pictures were exchanged by e-mail and Jocelyn was encouraged to submit a bid.

Realizing the opportunity, Jocelyn Fire decided to send Assistant Chief Rick Sirvio and me, for a visual inspection and to negotiate a purchase. A quick trip was arranged to Hamilton

and we viewed the truck at the Mount Hope station, where Mike Pittawa, a fire fighter at that station explained all the workings of the unit.

The truck was in excellent condition, no doubt due to the stringent maintenance schedule of Mr. Kay's Mechanical Department. A purchase price was agreed upon, along with the equipment being left with the truck. We were assured that the process for decommissioning the unit would be done as quickly as possible, knowing the urgency for the Jocelyn Fire Department.



Within 10 days, Mr. Doyle had contacted Rick to come and get Jocelyn's new tanker! We made another quick trip to Hamilton where we found the truck ready to roll. Bob Kay had arranged and completed the safety inspection and had come back from his holidays to see that everything would go through with the ownership change. After a small hitch with the

emissions test, which Mr. Kay arranged to have done, everything was completed.

The Jocelyn Fire Department is very grateful to the Hamilton Fire Department and to Jim Doyle and Bob Kay for their efforts in getting them the truck in such a timely manner.

Tanker 19, as it was called by the Hamilton Department, is now in service for Jocelyn Fire Department and, in tribute to our Hamilton friends, it will keep the name Tanker 19!

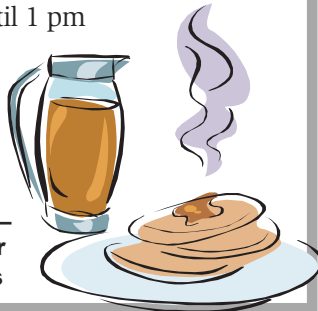

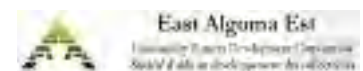

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## RECIPE CORNER



### Nora Wessell's Zucchini Cake

- 2 C. flour
- 1 1/2 C. sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 3 eggs
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 C. chopped nuts.
- 1 C. raisins
- 2 C. grated zucchini
- 1 C. oil

Combine flour, salt, cinnamon, baking powder, baking soda. (set aside). Combine eggs, oil, sugar, zucchini, and vanilla in a large bowl. Beat until well mixed, then stir in flour mixture until smooth. Stir in raisins and nuts. Pour into a 9 x 13" pan lightly greased.

Bake at 350° F for 40 minutes or until done.

You can cover with icing or sprinkle with icing sugar.

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# PC DOCTOR

**QUESTION:** My laptop computer refuses to start. Yes, it is plugged in. I press the power button and nothing happens. It was OK last night when I shut it off. Help!

**ANSWER:** What you are about to read might revive your laptop computer. Know that your reluctant laptop computer is only sleeping and can be reawakened. Here's the reason why a laptop computer can accidentally find itself in this deep sleep state. When powering your laptop computer off, always wait for a complete shutdown, no lights, before closing the lid. It's human nature to be impatient. Without realizing it, you are anticipating full shutdown and begin to close the lid too soon. As luck will have it, the lid triggers a command to enter normal sleep state. Your laptop computer is struggling to complete a previous command to shutdown. Confronted with this dilemma, dazed and confused, the poor laptop computer slips into an uncharted sleep. If this has happened, you most certainly can revive your slumbering laptop computer. Unplug the AC power cord. Close and turn laptop computer over. Remove the battery. Turn laptop right side up and open. Press and hold the power button down for 10 seconds to drain off any residual electrical power. Close lid and turn over. Replace battery. Turn right side up. Since these cooling fans are difficult to replace, the entire video adapter should be replaced. A noisy fan quickly turns into a seized fan with dire, dire repercussions. Once your computer is beyond the warranty period, this noise will reoccur. The itsy-bitsy cooling fans typically bonded to video adapters are notorious noise makers. Replace the entire video adapter with one which has a mammoth heat sink but NO FAN. No moving parts means no noise. Problem solved.

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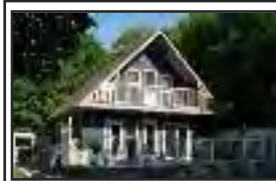

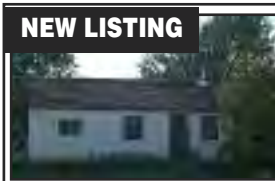

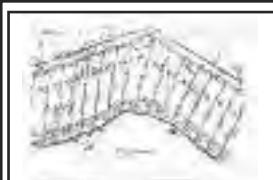

## Red Shirt Fridays

*We thank Dawn & Paul Rowe, whose nephew is in the Canadian Forces, for this touching reminder of the many sacrifices made for us by our Military Personnel, and by their families. It's from an email that has been in circulation for more than a year throughout the world - this is the "Canadian" version - but it's a story that bears repeating. The Editors have removed some personal originating information, to protect the family's privacy.*

Last week, while traveling to Toronto on business, I noticed an army sergeant traveling with a folded flag, but did not put two and two together. After we boarded our flight, I turned to the sergeant, who'd been invited to sit in First Class (across from me), and inquired if he was heading home.

"No", he responded. "Heading out", I asked? "No. I'm escorting a soldier home." "Going to pick him up?" "No. He is with me right now. He was killed in Afghanistan, I'm taking him home to his family."

The realization of what he had been asked to do hit me like a punch to the gut. It was an honour for him. He told me that, although he didn't know the soldier, he had delivered the news of his passing to the soldier's family and felt as if he knew them after many conversations in so few days.

I turned back to him, extended my hand, and said, "Thank you. Thank you for doing what you do so my family and I can

do what we do." Upon landing in Toronto, the pilot stopped short of the gate and made the following announcement over the intercom.

"Ladies and gentlemen, I would like to note that we have had the honor of having Sergeant Steeley of the Canadian Armed Forces join us on this flight. He is escorting a fallen comrade back home to his family. I ask that you please remain in your seats when we open the forward door to allow Sergeant Steeley to deplane and receive his fellow soldier. We will then turn off the seat belt sign."

Without a sound, all went as requested. I noticed the sergeant saluting the casket as it was brought off the plane, and his action made me realize that I am proud to be a Canadian.

So here's a public Thank You to our military Men and Women for what you do so we can live the way we do.

### Red Fridays.

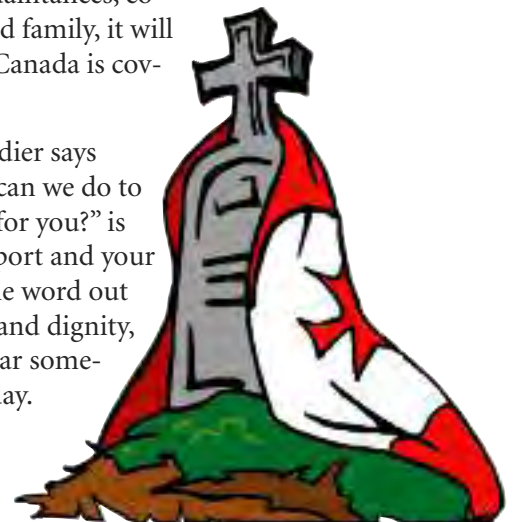
