PC DOCTOR

Question: Why is my Xplornet satellite high-speed Internet so slow? Some days nothing works. No email. No Internet. Is there anything I can do?

Answer: Call Xplornet Technical Support at 1-866-841-6001. Have your customer number handy, including correct billing address. Support individuals are very sticky about only talking to the account holder. You must have that person there or you have to temporarily assume the missing identity. Level 1 Technical Support has an extreme aversion to routers. Do not mention or admit to using a router as part of your home network. The poor router immediately will be deemed the culprit for all your satellite Internet woes, and you will be told to call the router manufacturer instead. Having trouble with an uncooperative techie? Hang up, redial.

Level 1 Xplornet Technical Support has the ability to diagnose satellite receiver malfunction or misalignment problems. If your Internet speed has been restricted due to the Fair Access Policy (FAP), you should be told details regarding alleged over-use and expected recovery time.

The Fair Access Policy (FAP) was meant to control the small percentage of satellite Internet users who over-use this service downloading music and videos. FAP has been restated under a new label, Traffic Management Policy. I recommend that Xplornet customers go to www.xplornet.com to read this article for a clearer understanding of why and how Xplornet monitors and restricts Internet speed.

There are two Xplornet satellites: the older, original Telesat and the newer, out-sourced Hughes satellite. Older Telesat customers have a very small hour-by-hour limit that can be reduced significantly when technical difficulties arise. Hughes satellite customers are bound by a 200 megabyte limit per 24 hour period. How easy is it to exceed the 200 mb limit and trigger an Internet speed restriction? View 60 photos on a Facebook gallery: boom, sputter, sputter! View 10 YouTube clips: into the penalty box! Download 40 music tracks: you are cut off!

Once the Hughes satellite 200 mb limit has been exceeded, full recovery to normal Internet speed occurs after 24 hours. For example, the youngsters in your home feast on Facebook and YouTube during the afternoon. By evening your usage limit has been exceeded. Full recovery will occur tomorrow evening or 24 hours from now. Contact Xplornet Technical Support if you suspect that your Internet speed has been restricted. Confirm when speed restriction will be lifted. Refrain from using your satellite Internet for the duration. Attempts to use Internet while restricted only protracts penalty period.

A newer, high capacity satellite is expected to launch and be in service late 2011. Yes!
