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## The Island's Women's Institutes

Working with and for women in rural and small town Ontario.

THE YOUNG WOMAN WAS HEARTBROKEN. She was a mother of four, married eight years and considered an educated person. Yet she sat in the Hamilton Doctor's office and listened to the diagnosis that her youngest son had died from "summer complaint", an intestinal ailment then common among young children - likely the result of drinking contaminated milk.

Her grief was overwhelming, but her anger was greater and, in 1889 after her young son's burial, Adelaide Hoodless devoted her life to a new cause - promoting domestic science education. This bereaved mother turned

personal tragedy into a public movement. Most accounts of the history of the Women's Institutes (WI) of Ontario start with this remarkable woman.

What is the Women's Institute? That is the million dollar question and perhaps one of the best kept secrets in the world. Everyone living in Ontario today has been exposed to the efforts of this organization. But because most of their work and lobbying efforts have been done quietly, their achievements go unheralded.

Would you know that it was WIs who were instrumental in getting white lines painted on the centre of provincial high-

ways, florescent paint on the sides of railway cars for easier night visibility at rural crossings, stop signs at railway crossings, poison labeling clearly marked on containers, the pasteurization of milk, 4H Homemaking Clubs, rural libraries & community halls, the law making it mandatory for traffic to stop for school buses and breathalyzer and blood tests for motorists?

The Women's Institute movement officially started in February 1897 in Stoney Creek, with the "Domestic Crusader" Adelaide Hoodless. The Experimental Union of Farmers' Institute established a women's organization, so women could study homemaking in the same manner that their husbands studied farming. WIs offered women the chance to socialize but, more importantly, to learn how to work together to improve the quality of life for themselves, their families, their communities and even the world.

In the early days, a Women's Institute Branch was associated with a local farmer's union. As a farming community, St. Joseph Island once had a total of nine Branches, the first being Carterton, located in Jocelyn Township's 'Mountain' area. Organized in 1902, Carterton seems to be the first WI Branch in the Algoma and Sudbury districts.

With settlements spread across the island, several Branches sprang up, to provide more reasonable distances for members to travel. Eleanor Adcock recalls that her mother used to walk four or five miles to get to her meeting. Eleanor joined her first Branch at the age of 15, with special permission.

Marie Rains was a WI member for 60 years before her recent passing. She started in 1946 with the Mountain Branch, then moved to the Sailor's Encampment Branch, then on to the Clover Valley Branch, of which she was a past president. At a February 1, 1951 Mountain Meeting, Marie's daughter Gloria, along with her brother Brian, were entered into the records as "special guests." Gloria Hawdon remains an integral member of the Clover Valley Branch to this day.

Over the past century, the Island has seen several Branches come and go as its local communities have evolved. Kentvale organized in 1905 and disbanded in 1953. Richards Landing organized in 1906 and celebrated its 100th Anniversary in 2006. A Line (Sailor's Encampment) organized in 1917 disbanded in 1920, Reorganized in 1925 and disbanded again in 1968. Hilton Beach organized in 1920 and disbanded in 1991. Tenby Bay organized in 1919 but shortly disbanded, as

the community petered out. Similarly, the Mountain (Carterton) organized in 1902 and disbanded in 1924. There is also some mention on record of a Branch at Milford Haven. Clover Valley organized in 1948 and is still active.

Organizationally, several Branches make up a District. In 1978 the St. Joseph District amalgamated with the North Shore District, to form our current District. Each District is part of the provincial organization known as the Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario (FWIO) which was organized in 1919, giving Branch Members a stronger, united voice. Since then, FWIO's educational programs and social events have created new opportunities for rural and small town Ontario women, locally and provincially. The organization is proud of its contributions to Ontario, with several landmark advocacy achievements in public health, food safety systems and community development to its credit.

For more than 100 years, Women's Institute members have actively worked together for the betterment of Members' families, homes and communities. Their original focus - domestic science education - quickly expanded to include personal growth opportunities, government lobbying and health and community wellness initiatives.

The Island Branches were responsible for the distribution of goiter tablets and iodine (dulce), tonsil clinics, TB clinics, promoting immunization, dental care for students, prevention of diphtheria and public nurse visits. The Cancer Society, Children's Aid, Muscular Dystrophy and the Red Cross are only a few of the agencies and organizations who have benefited from WI fund-raising activities.

At present the two Island Branches help support the SJI Museum, Children's Library and both public libraries on the island. It was the Hilton Beach WI who established the Hilton Beach library in 1920 and served as its first executive board. The trophy at grade eight graduation ceremonies at CASS is

provided by the Clover Valley WI. Local charities and volunteer organizations are also recipients of WI donations. The Women's Institute Park, outside Richards Landing is a living legacy, popular with families even today. The Island WIs' principal fundraising event is their annual Quilt Show, which brings visitors from far and wide.

So now, what is the Women's Institute? It is many things to many different women. Our vision is an Ontario where women can work together for safe, healthy families and communities, as well as pursue an enriched and balanced lifestyle. Our values reflect mutual respect and support, communication, healthy members and a healthy environment, versatility and adaptability. We advocate for social, environmental and economic change, and work towards the personal growth of all women.

Why not come out to one of our upcoming Branch meetings and find out for yourself? Both Branches will be resuming their regular meetings in September. The **Clover Valley Branch** meets on the **first Tuesday of every month** at Harmony St. Mark's Fellowship Hall at 7:30 pm. Mark your calendar for Tuesday, September 7, 2010. The presentation will be 'Adult Literacy' and there is always a delicious lunch provided by two members who act as hostess.

The **Richards Landing Branch** meets on the **third Thursday of each month** at Noon, at Harmony St. Mark's Fellowship Hall. Their first meeting will be Thursday, September 16th, with a guest speaker from the Children's Library. A scrumptious lunch will also be served.

Anyone and everyone is welcome at either branch. The only qualification is your wanting to help make a positive difference – for your family, your community, your country and the world.

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## A St. Joseph Island Museum Moment

FOR AS LONG AS HUMANS have existed there has been conflict. We have fought for land, resources, religion, personal freedom, as well as the preservation of other peoples freedoms and liberties across the globe. Canada has had a long, and proud military tradition, and our courage, reliability, and dedication was particularly highlighted during the First and Second World Wars.

Here at the museum we have many fascinating military artifacts from Canadian soldiers and our allies, as well as those of our enemies. One such set of artifacts are our collection of helmets. Hanging on the wall is a helmet which belonged to and was worn by Jimmy Harten who donated it. It is typical of the "saucepan" style employed by the English as well as other Commonwealth countries. This style of helmet was used during both the First and Second World Wars and was used right through to the end of the Korean War. Right beside this helmet is a German helmet from the same era. It is of the stereotypical World War One German design with the large spike on the top. However this helmet was not very common and was typically reserved for officers, which made them sought after as souvenirs. In contrast to the heavy, all metal British helmet, the German helmet is made from a much lighter material and covered in wool. It is also much more ornate and contains a patriotic slogan on the brow.

Also of interest at the museum are the wide variety of pins, and medals on display. There are many pins representing the 119th Battalion which was a Canadian regiment that included many men from St. Joseph Island, and the surrounding area who enlisted and fought overseas during the First World War. It is important to note here that during the First World War, St. Joseph Island had the highest rate of volunteers per capita in all of Canada. Also on display at the museum are gold stars that indicate service on various fronts during the Second World War. Included in our collection are stars from Italy, and France and Germany where many hard battles were fought. The Atlantic Star is reserved for navy and merchant sailors who fought in the Atlantic theatre during the Second World War. These men braved the ocean, as well as the German Luftwaffe (air force), and Kriegsmarine (navy) in order to supply our English allies with much needed weapons, troops, and supplies. Among other pins and badges are RCAF (Royal Canadian Air Force) pins as well as a multitude of other pins and medals.

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## Keeping your Cottage in the Family!

### Cottage "Succession Planning"

Whether you call it a cottage, chalet, camp or cabin, it's your family's special place to relax and enjoy the great outdoors. And for many families, it's a place filled with happy memories that's been in the family for generations, and will be for generations to come.

But keeping the cottage in the family from one generation to the next isn't always as easy as it might seem. There are many issues to consider, including how the taxes will be paid.

### Consider ways to reduce taxes

When you pass along your cottage, you are also passing along a potentially large tax bill, which your beneficiaries may or may not be able to afford. Depending on their financial situation, your beneficiaries may be forced to sell the family cottage simply to cover the taxes! There are two main types of tax to consider – capital gains taxes and probate taxes.

### Capital gains taxes

If your cottage has been in the family for many years, its value has probably increased dramatically. The property your family bought for a few thousand dollars might be worth a few hundred thousand dollars today. Even property bought within your lifetime might have experienced this type of exponential growth.

This increase in value can result in a very large, taxable capital gain, which is triggered when you pass along the property to anyone other than your spouse, including your children. However, there are several ways you can address this tax bill, and even reduce or defer it.

### Calculating capital gains tax

When you pass along your cottage to anyone other than your spouse, the government views it as having been sold at current market value – a "deemed disposition." The capital gain on this deemed disposition is taxable. The following example

shows how a cottage purchased for only \$5,500 in 1977 can result in a \$68,512.50 tax bill in 2007:

Deemed disposition in 2007: \$310,000

Minus purchase price in 1977: \$5,500

Total capital gain: \$304,500

Capital gains taxable (50% of total): \$152,250

Taxes payable at 45% marginal rate: \$68,512.50

### Gift the property ahead of time

Simply giving your cottage to your intended beneficiaries ahead of time is one way to defer future capital gains taxes. If you expect your cottage to significantly increase in value, consider giving it to your beneficiaries sooner rather than later.

Assuming property values will always rise, this will trigger a taxable capital gain from the appreciation of the property to date. The tax is payable in the year the gift is made. However, it should be a much smaller capital gain than the one that would be triggered in the future, assuming the property increases significantly in value. Any future gains will be taxed in the names of your beneficiaries, when they sell it or give it away at a much later date, and won't be included in your final tax return when your estate is settled.

### Cover the tax bill with an insurance policy

The most common way for property to be passed on to the next generation is through a bequest made in your Will. When your property is bequeathed to anyone other than your spouse, it triggers a taxable capital gain, which your beneficiaries may not be able to afford. However, you can cover this tax bill through a life insurance policy, which provides a sum equal to the expected tax bill when your estate is settled.

## PC DOCTOR

**QUESTION:** Have you ever heard of “Virtual PC Doctor”? I received an unsolicited phone call from someone claiming to be with a business named “Virtual PC Doctor”. Normally, I hang up on telesales or telemarketers right away but my computer needs a tune-up so I listened. This foreign-sounding person showed me how to check the Administrator’s Event Log which shows that my computer has a lot of corrupt files. He said that he could fix all my computer problems remotely but first I had to go to a special website and sign in. I hesitated and he hung up. Is this “Virtual PC Doctor” legitimate or is it a scam?

**ANSWER:** The “Virtual PC Doctor” is a complete scam. By signing into this suspicious website you would permit these unknown individuals, in some faraway location, to have remote access to your computer. Not a good idea. While connected to your computer, these same unknown individuals might install spyware. This “Virtual PC Doctor” sounds like a new form of identity theft. You were right to hesitate.

Allowing a remote connection to be established with your computer opens a very big door. Letting a relative connect remotely or letting your Internet Service Provider connect remotely, when you have a computer problem, is reasonably safe. Letting an absolute stranger, during an unsolicited phone call, connect remotely is beyond dangerous.

Your computer encounters errors and recovers without your knowledge constantly. There’s no need to panic. Behind the scenes, Windows loses traction every once in a while but regains balance and forges ahead. Only the most serious errors that result in pop-up messages or the dreaded blue-screen-of-death require your attention. Many wee problems are handled in the background so as not to disturb your computer session. If you are interested in checking background activity, go to Control Panel, Administrative Tools, and click on Event Viewer. Your computer records information messages, warnings, and errors during every computer activity. The “Virtual PC Doctor” bends the truth by saying that this event log indicates corrupt files. The Event Viewer and the corresponding event log will always contain information messages. It’s just a simple hiccup, not food poisoning.

**QUESTION:** I have just purchased a new laptop computer. What should I know about caring properly for this major investment?

**ANSWER:** Proper care and feeding of a new laptop computer is essential if you expect to keep this computer working reliably. Always place laptop computer on a clean hard surface. Cushioned surfaces, sofas, beds, and carpets tend to block cooling vents and cause overheating. Keep all drinks, cigarettes, and food away from your clean healthy laptop computer. Keep a can or compressed air handy to clear vents and keyboards. Laptop screens are delicate. Touch LCD frame only. Use damp soft cloth for wiping.
