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Freddie Kent Goes for the Quad!

Fred Kent is a soft-spoken, shy and modest man. That's a little odd, given that he's also a music legend and an icon of Canadian country fiddling. Whether it be old-time waltzes, jigs and reels or 'good ole country tunes', Fred Kent brings a fresh, sweet sound to everything he plays.

In today's age of short-lived, egomaniacal music groups and 'one-hit wonders' it's wonderful to see that one group, at least, has been together since the early 1950's and is still having fun. Even after more than 60 years, the very mention of Fred Kent and his fellow 'Northernaires' is enough to pack any concert or dance hall to the rafters.

And yet, Fred shies away from the spotlight, on or off stage. He's happier talking about the friends he's played and shared great times with, rather than about himself. To Fred, the story isn't about him at all; it's about everyone who shared the stage with him. And there have been a few!

"I got my start just after World War II, playing dances in the old Kentvale hall across from the store, with my brother Harold and my sister Leona. Those first dances were for returning service men who brought back English war-brides. The community wanted to welcome these women and get to know them and, since we had missed their weddings, we would put on receptions to welcome them to their new home."

By then, the music bug had a firm bite on Fred, and he began looking for other opportunities to play and entertain on a more regular basis. "My first job with a regular band was with the Barton Orchestra, led by Maurice Barton and his sister Francis Bishop

and my brother Harold. Most of our jobs were on St. Joe but we did get a few on the mainland and once we played at the Palm Gardens in the Sault!" he smiles.

As the 1940s gave way to the 1950s, the time came for Fred and some of his pals to form their own band, and although they instantly 'gelled' as a music group, they simply couldn't figure out what to call themselves! The solution to that problem came from one of their first gigs. "Actually it was Ann and Bill Young, the proprietors of the original 'Dew Drop Inn' who cooked up the idea." Fred tells us. "They held a contest, and the winning name was 'The Northernaires'. The name has stuck ever since, even as the band continued to mature and evolve.

The Real Estate Stop

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Bill Haight, another “Islander” and music legend in his own right, was the lead singer for the Northernaires for the next 15 years. During those years, they played regular Saturday night dances in the Bruce Mines Community Hall.

But time doesn't let things stand still. When work forced Fred's sister Leona Read to move to Southern Ontario, the Northernaires lost their regular piano player, which prompted more cast changes and a new generation of Northernaires. They made some big changes: “Ray Mador took over

playing the piano. We added Keith MacKay on lead guitar and later, Keith's brother Jim on bass, and Addy Metivier joined the band on steel guitar.” Fred recounts.

Then things really took off for the Northernaires! For the next eight years, they had their own weekly radio and television show, with Don Ramsay as MC. But Fred's self-effacing modesty, coupled with his dry humour quickly comes to the forefront: “Although our shows had top ratings, there was



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only one TV station at the time. So you either watched our show or turned the set off!" he laughs.

But time kept marching relentlessly forward. By 1964, the shows had run their course. Keith and Jim MacKay left the Sault to further their musical careers. They had both married girls from the Bruce Mines area. After travelling across Canada for some time, Keith and his wife Linda settled in Kitchener. Jim and his wife Juanita went into horse training in Brantford, Ont.

The Northernaires re-grouped again. Pianist Ray Mador took over on bass and banjo. Bill Eaton became the band's lead singer, and also showed his proficiency on lead guitar, remaining a mainstay of the group to this day. Then, let's not forget Randy McDonald, who has been the Northernaires' hard-working drummer all through the years.

And what years they've been! The boys in the band still had to earn a living at a "real" job. As Fred describes it, "Playing clubs at night and all of us having day jobs made for some tired mornings getting up for work." he smiles as he shakes his head. "Now that we're all retired except for Randy, we enjoy getting together at least once a week to play in nursing and retirement homes in and around the Sault area." OK, maybe the Northernaires HAVE slowed down, just a tad.

And now, after some 42 years, it looks like things might even come full circle! After a successful musical career, Keith and Linda MacKay, now retired, decided to move back to Sault Ste. Marie – and he quickly agreed to bring his guitar and his voice back to the Northernaires!

Keith's brother Jim has done well in horse farming over the years, but the connection to music is alive and well with his family too. His grandchildren – Tyrel, 16, Logan, 13, and Bailey Donaldson age 10, are talented musicians and singers too. With their grandfather Jim playing banjo, they've appeared at bluegrass events throughout Southern Ontario and, at a recent horse show in Wyoming, they entered a talent show that was being held in conjunction with the event, and took first prize. They're coming to visit here in Algoma at the end of July.

Then, let's not forget Fred and Joy's 'pride and joy', their son Andrew! He began his musical training at the age of six – on the fiddle of course! - and won the Kiwanis Music Festival's Shield when he was 11 years old. He was in the music program at Queens University in Kingston when he met his wife to be, Brenda Mosher from Windsor, Nova Scotia.

For the next 15 years, Andrew travelled throughout Alberta, playing as a duo with his partner Rick Guest, also a Maritimer. Andrew and Brenda married in Calgary during those years and had four children there, before moving to the Maritimes - home to many of Canada's best known fiddlers.

He has added Celtic fiddle to a well known Rock band that flew to Halifax to record with him, and he teaches several violin students in and around the Windsor Nova Scotia area.

And wouldn't you know! Andrew, Brenda, their daughter Laura and son Drew, all talented musicians and singers, are also coming to visit this month!

So there you have it! July offers not only the chance of a "Northernaires Reunion", but also brings in the next two generations as well! So if YOU were Fred Kent, what would YOU do, to celebrate a musical "homecoming" of this magnitude? You got it! Put on one heck of a show! And that's exactly what they're doing!

Jim Mackay will be there, sharing the stage with his grandchildren Tyrel, Logan and Bailey - the Donaldson Family Ranch-hands from Brantford, Ontario. Then, there's the Kent Family Band - Andrew, Brenda, Laura & Drew Kent, from Windsor, Nova Scotia.

A triple treat for music lovers! But what's this about a 'Quad'? What's the fourth treat?

He has a great voice and surrounds himself with some of the best musicians and singers we could name. It just seemed like a perfect fit to round out our concert and dance."

So watch for more information about this summer blockbuster. Mark **Saturday, July 30th** on your calendar and get out your dancing shoes (or boots)! The Show starts at 7 pm, with dancing from 9:30 pm to 1 am.

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And finally, Fred offers a friendly word of clarification to those readers who might not know what a "Barn Dance" offers. "You'll have to come to the show for the answer to that!" he chuckles.

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Algoma University Joins Project Hero

IN A CEREMONY earlier this month at the Sault Ste. Marie Cenotaph, Algoma University announced that they are now participating in Project Hero, a scholarship program providing financial aid for children of Canadian Forces personnel who have lost their lives while serving in an active mission.

"Becoming part of Project Hero makes sense for Algoma University, for many reasons," said university President, Dr. Richard Myers. "Sault Ste. Marie and the Algoma Region have a long and proud military tradition, and offering scholarships to the children of men and women who have made the ultimate sacrifice is the right thing to do."

Project Hero aims to reach as many post-secondary institutions as possible. Several universities, colleges and institutions have already made a commitment to participate. Criteria for the scholarship have been left up to individual institutions to define. For Algoma University, these include:

- The student must be a dependant (as defined by Revenue Canada) of a Canadian Forces member killed on active duty
- The student must be under the age of 26 at the time of application
- The Scholarship offers full tuition fees for full-time study
- It is renewable for a total of four years of full-time study, provided a good academic standing is maintained
- The student must be eligible for admission to Algoma University to be eligible for the award.

"Many Canadian service personnel have made the supreme sacrifice, whether it is in a war like Afghanistan, a UN Peacekeeping Mission or a Humanitarian Mission," said Lt. Col. Clyde Healey of the 49th Field Artillery Regiment. "To have the knowledge that a concern they may have for the future of their children is now taken care of by this very grateful contribution by Algoma University and other Canadian post-secondary institutions is one less thing that a Service Person has to worry about. The acceptance by Algoma's leadership of this program is very much appreciated."



Sheila O'Reilly's Zucchini Cake

- 3 eggs
- 1 C. vegetable oil
- 1/4 C. lemon juice
- 1 1/2 C. sugar
- 1 tsp. almond extract

Whisk together then stir in 2 C. grated raw zucchini (skin on)
1 C. shredded coconut.

In a separate bowl combine:


- 1-1/2 C. flour
- 2 tsp. baking soda
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. cloves

Gradually stir dry mixture into egg/zucchini mixture then add 3/4 C. fruit peel (or raisins). Bake at 350°F for 40-50 minutes in a 8"x12" pan

When zucchini are in season, shred zucchini, measure into 2 cup lots, and freeze in zip lock bags. When thawed the zucchini will be very watery and no longer measure a full 2 cups. However, use the full content of just one bag to replace the 2 cups called for in the recipe.

John was growing increasingly concerned about the baby's safety, as the fledgling was clearly exhausted and still exposed on the short grass of his lawn. But Mom wasn't giving up.

"Being the patient mother that she is, she would come and lay beside him until she thought it was time to go. Then she'd give him a bunt in the rear end, he would stand up, she would walk away and he would try to follow, but it was hard



going. She would come out of the long grass and try to persuade him into coming with her, but he would just stay in the short grass as it was easier to walk."

Eventually, Mom's efforts paid off. John kept watch through the entire struggle, in case some other, less welcome 'company' should come by, in search of a meal. "He would get tired again and lay down, and she would fetch him some grub and bring it back and feed it to him. He finally made it to the little bridge I have across the ditch and walked into the long grass. She was more at ease with him in there, but up until dark I could still hear him peeping away and she was cooing at him to let him know she was still there watching over him."

Over the next few days, John saw the trio again a few times, and the injured baby seemed to be making progress in recovering. Then on Friday, July 1st, he was able to give us a welcome update. "The little guy is getting better every day. He still has a slight limp but is getting around a lot better. Now, he doesn't hesitate to go into the long grass with Momma and Papa. He should be just like new in a few days."

And, on Monday, July 11th came John's cheerful update. "Just saw the family again for the first time in a long time and the little guy can run so fast now that I can't even get a picture of him, the little [bleep!]!"

Thanks for the good news, and the good story, John!

“Good Luck, Mr. Gorsky!”

Thanks to Connie and Gerry Rahn for sharing this entertaining and popular piece of ‘history’. Unfortunately, the story was originally made up as part of a Buddy Hackett comedy routine. It’s not really true, but it’s still an amusing story, and in that spirit, we present it for your enjoyment.

Since we try to hold to “family newspaper” values in our content, we’ve taken one very minor, but perhaps important editorial liberty, substituting ‘i’ for ‘e’ in a few places, but we think you’ll quickly get it.

ON JULY 20, 1969, as Commander of the Apollo 11 Lunar Module, Neil Armstrong was the first person to set foot on the moon. His first words after stepping on the moon, “That’s one small step for Man, one giant leap for mankind” were televised to earth and heard by millions.

But, just before he re-entered the lander, he made the enigmatic remark “Good luck, Mr. Gorsky.”

Many people at NASA thought that it was a casual remark concerning some rival Soviet cosmonaut. Upon checking, however, there was no Gorsky in either the Russian or American space programs.

Over the years, many people questioned Armstrong as to what the ‘Good luck, Mr. Gorsky’ statement meant, but Armstrong always just smiled. Finally, on July 5, 1995, in Tampa Bay Florida, while Mr. Armstrong was answering



questions following a speech, a reporter brought up the 26-year-old question. This time, he finally responded. Mr. Gorsky had died, so Neil Armstrong felt he could now answer the question.

In 1938, when he was a kid in a small Mid-western town, Neil was playing baseball with a friend in the backyard. His friend hit the ball, which landed in his neighbour’s yard, by their bedroom window. His neighbours were Mr. and Mrs. Gorsky.

As he leaned down to pick up the ball, young Armstrong heard Mrs. Gorsky shouting at Mr. Gorsky: “Six? You want six? You’ll get six when the kid next door walks on the moon!”

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Licensing Eased for RV Towing

ON MONDAY, JUNE 27TH, Ontario Minister of Transportation Kathleen Wynne announced that, effective July 1st, drivers can tow recreational vehicles (RVs) if they have a full class G license.

This will save RV enthusiasts about \$200 in initial licence costs. “Summer is a very popular season for the RV community. This timely change will make it easier for RV operators, will promote tourism and the overall RV experience in Ontario, while keeping our roads safe.” she said.

Until now, Ontario drivers have needed a class A licence to tow RVs that weigh more than 4,600 kg. With this change, Ontarians can tow RVs with a full class G licence as long as:

- The combined weight of the motor vehicle and RV is not more than the current 11,000 kg limit
- The RV is attached to the motor vehicle by a fifth wheel hook-up
- Only one vehicle is being towed
- The RV meets Transport Canada manufacturing standards, and
- The RV is being towed for personal use only.

Note, however that drivers must have a **full G** licence. G1 or G2 class licences are NOT eligible.

This change is consistent with the current requirements for operators of motor homes. It now aligns Ontario’s driver’s licence requirements for RVs with 6 Canadian Provinces and territories, as well as 41 U.S. states.
