## High and Low Tech Help in Illegal Hunting Arrests

ACCORDING TO A FEBRUARY 13TH NEWS RELEASE by the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources, an Elliot Lake area man has been fined \$3,000 and had his hunting licence suspended for two years, for illegal deer hunting on St. Joseph Island.

On November 15, 2011, Ministry of Natural Resources conservation officers investigated a complaint of a gunshot and an abandoned deer carcass. The responding officers found a digital game camera near the carcass and determined that it had been tampered with. A number of photos, presumably recording the illegal shooting, had been deleted.

But that didn't help the offender get away with it.

The Ontario Provincial Police Forensic Identification Services unit was called in and was able to locate and restore the "missing" photographs, even though the suspect had allegedly deleted them.

Justice of the Peace Phillip Stanghetta heard the case in the Ontario Court of Justice, Sault Ste. Marie, on February 2, 2012.

William J. Middleton, of Elliott Lake, pleaded guilty to hunting antlerless deer without a licence, abandoning game wildlife and obstructing a conservation officer. He received a



fine of \$1,000 on each charge.

Then, there's the 'Low Tech' approach – would you believe a fake deer - which resulted in two Sault residents being found guilty of illegally hunting from a pontoon boat.

On November 12, 2011, MNR enforcement officers set up on a lake near Blind River, which had been the site of several previous unsafe hunting offenses. They set up two deer decoys on the shoreline, and settled in to see what would develop. They didn't have to wait long.

Along came a pontoon boat operated by two men, one of whom who, mistaking the deer decoys for the real thing, began firing with a shotgun loaded with bird shot. Realizing their mistake, the two tried to escape,

but were quickly overtaken by the MNR officers.

Further compounding their problems, the two boaters began tossing beer cans overboard as they fled. When the officers caught up to the boat, they found still more beer aboard, but no life preservers.

The 'shooter' also confessed to shooting at a duck earlier in the day from the boat, using the same lead bird shot he used on the deer – a double offense. Lead shot is illegal when

hunting waterfowl as it could be ingested by ducks when they are feeding. Bird shot is illegal for “big game” hunting since it would most likely only wound a deer, causing unnecessary suffering for the animal.

Justice of the Peace Paula Nichols heard the case in the Ontario Court of Justice, Blind River, on February 1, 2012.

Adam Massolin of the Sault pleaded guilty and was fined \$200 for hunting a migratory bird from a power boat, \$200 for hunting a migratory bird using lead shot, \$750 for discharging a firearm from a boat and \$1,500 for using prohibited shot when hunting big game. His shotgun was also confiscated.

Michael Tuomela, also a Sault resident, pleaded guilty and was fined \$1,500 for using a boat for the purpose of killing wildlife, \$500 for depositing garbage, \$250 for having open liquor on a boat and \$250 for not having any life jackets.

Both men received a two-year hunting prohibition and must re-take the Ontario Hunter Safety Course before they can hunt again.

Unsafe hunting is not only illegal, it’s dangerous. To report a natural resources violation, call 1-877-TIPS-MNR (847-7667) toll-free any time. You can also call Crime Stoppers anonymously at 1-800-222-TIPS (8477).

# Manage Your Woodlot for Fun & Profit

HEALTHY AND PRODUCTIVE forests are an important part of the Algoma Region's landscape and all area residents recognize the importance of maintaining these valuable resources on both public and private lands. Private woodlot owners, and there are thousands of them in this region alone, have the opportunity of directly influencing forest health through the stewardship of their individual properties.

Ontario woodlots range in size from a few acres to tens of thousands, and are home to a full range of tree species: pine, cedar, spruce, maple, oak and basswood to mention a few. The reasons for owning a woodlot are as varied as the species within them. Some people manage their woodlots for income, some to preserve wildlife habitat, provide recreational opportunities or for a combination of reasons. The common thread that links owners together is their desire to manage their properties to the best of their ability to ensure their viability for generations to come.

The Ontario Woodlot Association (OWA) is an organization with over 1800 members in 19 regional chapters that promotes the sustainable management of Ontario's privately owned forests. It's a not-for-profit grassroots organization, governed by an elected volunteer board of directors, which provides its members with guidance and advice, and which represents their interests provincially through a united voice.

The OWA is the principal voice for private forest owners throughout Ontario and works actively to represent their concerns before government, the public and the forest industry. It's a key source of information about sustainable forest management and private land ownership and educates its members through workshops, conferences, field trips, publications and newsletters. Provincially, the association publishes a high quality newsletter, The S and W Report, which is only available to members. The S and W Report provides woodlot owners with practical 'how to' information on woodlot management and news of people, events and issues affecting the ownership and management of private forests.

By developing a strong network of regional chapters, the OWA has been able to ensure that the concerns of their members from all areas of the province are heard and acted upon. Locally, the Algoma Chapter of approximately 50 members represents our region. Every year, the chapter organizes tours of area woodlots to see how local owners are managing their properties for maple syrup, wildlife habitat, timber production or usually, a combination of objectives.

In winter months, presentations on topics such as invasive species, wildlife in the woodlot, non-timber forest products or how to start woodlot management take place. At this year's Annual General Meeting in late March, we expect to have an O.P.P. specialist talk on the timely topic of timber theft.

## Elliott Lake Publisher Dies in Snowmobile Accident

LAST SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 11TH just before 11 pm, East Algoma OPP, Emergency Medical Services and an OPP Technical Collision Investigator responded to a reported single snowmobile collision on Little Pickerel Lake, approximately 40 km north of Thessalon.

Raymond Ethelston, 60, was visiting friends at a camp at the lake. Sometime between 9:30 and 10:00 pm, he left on his snowmobile for his own camp. When the man failed to notify his friends of his safe arrival, they went looking for him. They subsequently located him and his machine farther along the shore.

It's believed that he was closely following the shoreline in a heavy snow squall and hit a large rock. He was thrown from the machine, hitting another rock, then was pinned against it by his machine. He was pronounced dead at the scene. The accident remains under investigation by OPP and the Provincial Coroner's office.

Mr. Ethelston was a prominent figure in Elliott Lake and throughout Northern Ontario, as publisher of the Quebecor/Sun-Media-owned Elliott Lake Standard and Mid-North Monitor publications for over 20 years.

## Meatballs and Sauce

### Sauce:

- 3 tbsp. olive oil
- 3/4 C. chopped onion
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 (16 ounce) cans crushed tomatoes
- 3 (6 ounce) cans tomato paste
- 1 C. water
- 2 tbsp. of sugar
- 1/8 C. chopped fresh oregano
- 1 dried bay leaf

### Meatballs:

- 1 pound ground round
- 1/2 cup Italian seasoned bread crumbs
- 1/4 C. chopped fresh parsley
- 1/8 C. chopped fresh oregano
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1/2 C. grated parmesan cheese
- salt and pepper to taste

Heat the olive oil in a large saucepan over medium heat, and cook the onion until lightly brown. Mix in 2 cloves garlic, and cook 1 minute. Stir in crushed tomatoes, tomato paste, water, sugar, 1/2 the oregano, and bay leaf. Season with salt and pepper. Bring to a boil, reduce heat to low, and simmer while preparing meatballs.

In a bowl, mix the ground round, bread crumbs, remaining oregano, remaining garlic, parsley, eggs, and cheese. Season with salt and pepper. Roll into 1 inch balls, and drop into the sauce. Cook 40 minutes in the sauce, or until internal temperature of meatballs reaches a minimum of 160° F (72 degrees C).

Serve the meatballs and sauce over your favourite cooked pasta.




