I called again and the process went pretty much the same as the first call until [click!] "Thank you for calling Old Ma Tel. My name is Peggy, how may I help you?" said that same friendly, soft and silky voice. Wow! What are the odds against that!

Although I was delighted that I wouldn't have to start all over from scratch with a new operator, Peggy, for some reason couldn't remember me or our conversation of a week or so earlier. I gave her my Confirmation Number for cancelling the "private line". "Ah! I see now!" she replied after checking her computer screen. "The system assigned that Confirmation Number to TWO lines, and as a result, it didn't "save" for the right line." A couple of audible clicks as she tapped her keys and she brightly said "There! I've fixed it! You shouldn't have any more trouble!"

We made our move to the Island, took over publishing the Island Clippings, turned our camp into a home and started our new life. Then, on April 14, 2010 came a rather nasty shock in our mail: what I thought to be our regular phone bill was in fact a bill from Old Ma Tel, forwarded from our old address, in the amount of \$275 including interest, on the unpaid "private line" - that very line featured in not one, but TWO conversations with Peggy four months earlier. Furthermore, I had never received ANY bill for it during those four months.

Indignantly, I scooped up the phone and called their Customer Service department. Again, after a 10 minute wait, during which my rage mounted to white hot intensity, I was pleased to hear ... "Thank you for calling Old Ma Tel. My name is Peggy, how may I help you?"

"Peggy! Darling!" I gushed. "It's me! [name withheld]" Again, she seemed to not remember me, but I once again gave her my Confirmation Number, and once again I heard those reassuring words: "There! I've fixed it! You shouldn't have any more trouble!" And I didn't ... until the mail arrived on September 7th 2010. And in that mail was another "private line" bill, now for \$523!

This time, I didn't get Peggy. Instead, I got Amy, who although she didn't say it out loud, clearly thought that Peggy must have been incompetent. "Ah! I see what the problem is!" she replied after checking HER computer screen. "The system assigned that Confirmation Number to TWO lines, and as a result, it didn't "save" for the right line." A few keyboard clicks later she announced "There! I've fixed it! You shouldn't have any more trouble!" And she was right ... at least until July 21st, 2011 when ... you guessed it!

THIS time, I “owed” \$1,285 in unpaid service, interest and penalties ... on a phone line that I had cancelled over a year earlier.

That did it! I grabbed the phone, ready to take a three-inch-deep strip off of whoever had the misfortune to answer my call. Surely there had to be someone in that organization who could fix the darn problem or any further communication would be from my lawyers.

My name is Richard, how may I help you?” In a voice close to that of a sailor hailing the maintop in a blowing gale, I quickly and succinctly outlined for poor Richard exactly how he could help me. So what will happen now? Will I be hunted down like a dog in the street by Old Ma Tel’s thugs? Will they contact my employer to garnishee my wages? Based on the pattern so far, we’ll find out, sometime in November 2012.

Participants and spectators enjoyed homemade cookies, juice and Island Roasters coffee. The morning ended with presentation of prizes in the Jim Snider machinery shed.

Visitor Restrictions In Effect on 3 B Medical Unit at SAH

Due to an outbreak of Vancomycin Resistant Enterococci on the 3B Medical Unit (B Wing, 3rd floor inpatient unit), visitor restrictions have been implemented. Visiting hours on this unit are restricted to between 2 and 4 p.m. and 6 and 8 p.m. daily until further notice. Only one visitor per patient will be allowed, with no visitors under the age of twelve.

This action is necessary to protect the well-being of patients, staff and visitors. However, exceptions may be made on compassionate grounds.

Regular visiting hours and rules are in effect for all other areas of the hospital.



Can you afford NOT to wear a PFD?

Last year, 22 people were lost in drowning deaths in Ontario, 18 of them were not wearing a Personal Floatation Device (PFD) or a life jacket.

In Northeastern Ontario alone, 6 men drowned, none of them wearing a PFD.

Some complain that the PFD is too uncomfortable. The technology of PFD has come a long way, you don't even notice they are on, until you are in the water fighting for your life. The common response - I have a life jacket right here in the boat - just simply doesn't hold water! When an emergency happens you don't have time to put one on - it's unexpected and almost impossible to get one on once you're in the water, that's if you can reach your life jacket at all. Cold water upsets are even deadlier.



I often hear that the cost of PFD is too expensive. If inflated, recharging costs another \$20.

Thousands of dollars are spent on our water sports, but regrettably, safety comes at too high a price for some people.

My quick calculation for the cost of fishing may drive the point home - boat and motor \$4,000 - \$30,000; fishing gear \$300 - \$1,000; trolling motor \$150 - \$600; sunglasses \$160 - \$300; self-inflating personal floatation device (PFD) \$120 - \$600. In the big picture, a PDF is not much of an expense - it's a cost of doing business that could save your life.

On the flip side, the average cost of a funeral in Ontario is \$10,000.


Please, this season wear a PFD - your families will thank you.




Fire at Jocelyn Landfill Site




