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## It's Forest Fire Season. Almost 50 fires already reported

WITH CONDITIONS IN OUR AREA as wet as they have been, it's hard to imagine that there could already be any risk of forest fires. Yet there is. The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources reports that there have already been 49 fires reported in the Northeast Region since the 2013 forest fire season began on April 1st. 19 fires were reported just in the three days from April 26 to 29, while 16 fires were reported just this past weekend, from May 3 to 6. Some still remain listed as NOT under control.

The good news is that this is well down from the 164 fires reported in the same period last year. Although the fire risk across the northern parts of the province is reportedly low, let's not get too complacent about what could happen here. In fact, conditions in the Sault/Sudbury/Kirkland Lake triangle have just been upgraded to **High Risk** for fire.

All of the fires reported this year to date have been human-caused.

With the return of spring weather, residents want to get outside and clean up their properties from the effects of winter. And every year, people burning grass or debris ignite wildfires, resulting in thousands of dollars in damage to property, homes, barns and

cottages, not to mention injury or death for humans and animals alike.

During the spring, grass and forest fuels are dry and fires can spread out of control quickly.

Residents planning on burning grass, brush or other wood debris should obtain a Fire Permit, but even that is NOT a licence to burn irresponsibly. Perhaps it might be a better idea to consider composting, mulching, chipping or taking the material to a landfill site instead.

If you must burn, don't burn when it is windy. Light your fire two hours before sunset or later and burn a safe distance from anything that could catch fire. Always keep your fire small and stay with it until it is dead out. If you have neighbours close by, think too about how much smoke you might be making, and whether or not someone downwind might be bothered by it.

Remember that if you light it, you are responsible for it. That means if you light a fire and that fire turns into a wildfire you

can be held responsible for the costs of putting that fire out. This can range in to the thousands of dollars.

And the cost in lives could not be measured in mere dollars. Something to think about!

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## Crime Update

### One Caught; Others Soon to Follow?

IT APPEARS THAT THERE HAS ALREADY been a big break in tracking down the St. Joe Work Site thieves, as reported in last week's issue. Although neither the OPP nor the Sault Police Services have yet released any official statements, sources close to the investigation have revealed that one person has been apprehended and charged with a number of offenses related to the crime.

The suspect, a 20 year old male from the Sault, reportedly tried to pawn one of the stolen chainsaws last week. The pawnbroker, alert to the possibility of the saw being stolen, called police, who were there waiting to nab the youth when he left the store.

The suspect has been charged with at least two offenses, and will be appearing in court in late June. Meanwhile, the noose is tightening in the search for the other two suspects, who have not yet been (officially at least) identified.

The three suspects may also be connected to other break-ins in the Beech Beach area that occurred during the same time period.


