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
A Wonderful Day for a Walk!

This is an annual event to raise funds for Lions Foundation Canada Dog Guides, a non-profit organization started by supported by and loved by Lions Clubs from coast to coast.

The Dog Guide Training Centre is operated with no government funding at all—simply by donations from Lions Clubs across Canada—and by corporate donations from major supporters like Purina, as well as many other donors from business and private sources. The Training Centre, in Oakville, Ontario, breeds and trains select breeds of dogs to become assistants to people with physical or medical conditions, thus helping those individuals attain more independence and confidence —“a new leash on life”. Lions Foundation is the founder and funder of Dog guides Canada and is an accredited member of several professional Assistance Dog Organizations.

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Homeward Bound

THERE ARE STORIES OF PETS that have travelled a great distance and meeting great peril to find their family and loved ones. I've met one of those pets.



His name is Murphy, a Brussels Griffon. For those such as I, not familiar with this breed, Murphy is very small dog which makes this story of his journey so much more amazing. His owner, Moriah travelled to Quebec to get him when he was five months old, never thinking just how much love and devotion she would get from her new family member. And without question, she knows now.

For the first seven years of his life Murphy lived in Richards Landing and in the last year he moved onto the North shore, North of Highway 17 West in the Neebish Road area. Murphy has a strong bond with Moriah - this breed is known to be a 'one person' pet. They go everywhere together and spend as much time together as possible. He is silent and just wants to be held.

On May 3rd Moriah left for work and when she returned, he was gone! He is eight years old now and had never left before. When she left for work, perhaps he left to find her. When he was missing overnight, great concern had set in. After a couple days, Moriah put up flyers from Sault Ste. Marie to Thesalon including St. Joe's, hoping that someone somewhere would see him and call.

"Nothing happened for what seemed like a long time. The mere thought of all the hazards he would encounter such as traffic, birds of prey, bears, bobcats, coyotes, wolves and in searching far and wide seeing so many foxes!" Moriah said.

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With flyers now in place she talked to all the Municipalities, road crews, bus lines - even posted it on Facebook - everywhere she could think to get the word out. Phone calls started coming in with people saying "I think I saw him" even at four in the morning and she would go and search the area people thought they had seen him. It was encouraging to know he was seen, but can you imagine the stress of not finding him there as he kept moving on.

People were telling her that they tried to catch him but he wouldn't go to anyone; he was on a mission. Phone calls reported him being seen at Kent's Corner and at the McBride residence on the V Line. Because he had been spotted on the McBride property a couple of times she took his little house, bed and some food and camped in the yard hoping to find him. Once she even came face to face with him and she called him! He wouldn't come to her; he seemed different "like he was in survival mode" Moriah tells us.

Eventually he made it to the back door of the house where he used to live in Richards Landing! Moriah had left a flyer with the people who had bought the house in which they used to live and it was from there that a phone call came at 5 am saying "You won't believe who is here!" Murphy was at the back door of the house and barked ..."I'm Home"! The new owners opened the door and he walked right in! He did allow them to feed him a couple of hot dogs, but he wouldn't let them come up to him as he didn't know them. He is pretty timid. Once Moriah arrived at the house, she called him and he came running!

He was very thin, dehydrated, had two porcupine quills in him and two ticks. His tiny paws had open, raw sores from walking so far in the last 12 days. One porcupine quill was deep under the eye and into his cheek while the other was protruding from inside his nose. Moriah thought that perhaps, because there were only two quills that maybe he had come upon a dead Porcupine and, desperate for food had tried to eat it.

While he was gone, both Moriah and her grandfather did research to learn the traits of the breed to see if they could fig-

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ure out where he might be. They learned that the breed is known for resilience, which Murphy certainly has proven. Brussels Griffons are known as “Velcro Dogs” meaning that they stick to one person. There are not many of them around.

Moriah took him to the vet to be checked and she put him on an antibiotic because of the quills and sores. He has gained weight again and his sores are almost healed now. Moriah and Murphy would like to say a special Thank You to all the people who were on the “Murf Hunt” searching for him and calling in with spotting along his journey.

Thanks to everyone’s help, Moriah and Murphy are together again!
