Island Population Climbs to All Time High!

This may come as a big surprise to some and others maybe not so much, but the population of the island has increased by over 10% since the last census data was collected five years ago. That's almost double the national average.

Even though 4 of the 10 slowest growing cities in Canada are located in Northern Ontario, our island seems to be doing quite well with all the townships and the village of Hilton Beach showing growth over the past five years. Jocelyn saw the highest growth, and it has surpassed Hilton as the 2nd most populated township. St. Joseph township continues to lead the way by a large margin adding 39 full-time residents.

Compare this to Sault Ste Marie, which saw a 2.4% population decrease, and Eliot Lake, Timmins and North Bay seeing even greater declines. Even Thunder Bay did not see any measurable growth, basically remaining the same. So why is the Island's population growing at nearly double the rate of the rest of Canada, and considerably more than the cities of Northern Ontario? The truth is we don't know for



sure, but here is some speculation on our part:

With an aging rural and semi rural population, people retiring from these northern Ontario cities are looking for homes to retire in and instead of staying in their city, they are choosing to move to a more scenic, quiet location to enjoy the outdoors more. We are still close enough to the Soo to make use of its amenities, but also have enough essentials here for day to day living. Additionally, younger people like ourselves seek alterna-

tives to the pricey markets of most larger cities and instead of choosing to make a smaller city their home, they choose a rural setting like this. It's also very possible some part time residents have decided to become year-round residents. The dollar, the US election, or the fact that winter is not as harsh as it once was could all be contributing factors, though unless we go door to door and ask, we may never know for sure. Perhaps it's the simple fact that St. Joseph Island is a lovely place to live.

Besides the retirement appeal, there are business opportunities here as well. Here are just some examples over the

St. Joe Creature Feature

Upside Down Birds

These small birds with large heads, called nuthatches, are agile birds that creep around tree trunks and will often forage upside down. There are several species of nuthatches, two of which are found on the island: the red-breasted nuthatch and the white-breasted nuthatch. White-breasted nuthatches are grey-blue with a white underbelly and red-breasted nuthatches are blue-grey with a rusty coloured underbelly. The main difference between the two is that the red-breasted nuthatch has a black cap and a black stripe through its eyes.

Nuthatches get their name from their tendency to jam nuts into tree bark then hammering them open with their beaks, or “hatching” them. They typically eat insects in the summer and eat conifer seeds and other seeds they cached away during the summer months. They are a common sight at bird feeders, often joining flocks of chickadees in the winter. The nuthatches can understand chickadee songs and use them to alert them of danger.

There are other species of even smaller nuthatches like the pygmy nuthatch which can be found from BC to northern Mexico and the brown-headed nuthatch, which can be found in the southeastern United States. Other species of nuthatches can be found all over Eurasia, some as big as 7 inches long and others with beautiful purple and blue plumage.

last five years: Katherine Henshell, although originally from the Island, moved back with husband Thomas and their family and are now the owners of The Island Market & The Deal House, and she is also bringing her legal services to the Island. Gardiner's Corner has also changed ownership. Masters Fibre Mill is another newer business. Lots of other businesses are for sale around the island. On our own street there are plenty of newcomers and houses up for sale: David & Jackie Emiry have their dairy farm, Paul and Marigje Cooper have returned to full time island living. Then of course there's us. Five years ago we never even heard of this island and here we are today, writing about how much it's grown over that length of time. The infrastructure has certainly improved in recent years with the cell towers leading the way. Despite our shellshock with internet, a few years ago it was virtually impossible to have semi high speed internet throughout most of the Island. Working from home has become much easier.

For two years before we moved here we kept a close eye on properties we liked around the island. Some of those houses would be on the market for months, even years. All of those houses are long gone and they began to sell faster as we continued our search. Even before we settled on this house, some of the ones we looked at would sell before we could make our minds up.

We're certainly no experts and can only speculate, but with homesteading becoming a trend, average joes being pushed out of the pricey urban markets, or people being discontent with urban living, it is possible the island could see more newcomers moving in. The country-wide trend show people are generally preferring to stay in or near the big cities, with 1/3rd of the population located in Toronto, Montreal, and Vancouver. That still leaves 2/3rd of the population to spread out to places such as this. While it is certainly surprising to see this much growth, for those who fear change is on the horizon we don't think things will change that drastically, at least not anytime soon, but it's nice to see others from many different places and many different walks of life choosing to call this island home. For those that either have business interests or hope to start something to allow year-round living, a population increase can only help. But don't fret, we are probably still a long ways away from getting traffic lights.

Homo Deus: A Brief History of Tomorrow

Homo Deus (human god) explores the future of the human species. The book is based on the premise that the characteristics of human history, famine, plagues and war, are being overcome through technology (despite what we may feel given everything in the news today) by immortality, bliss and divinity and will result in the next stage for our species.

As a species we have evolved and the author makes the case that Homo Sapiens is not the last evolution. The evidence Harari uses to predict the future is how we currently use technology, and our behavior.

Data will become the new religion with information entrusted to electronic algorithms, whose capacity far exceeds that of the human brain. Harari predicts the creation of an "Internet of All things" where all data is shared with everyone, shifting from homo-centric to data-centric world. These highly intelligent algorithms will know us better than we know ourselves. As in all predictions, he states, it can also be an opportunity to be thoughtful on how we choose to go forward as a species.

The book is divided into three sections, where the author goes into considerable depth to explain his rationale;

In first section the author examines humans and other animals, and identifies what makes our species so special.

The second section of the book examines how what he calls the humanist creed came into being; a world that currently revolves around humans.

The final third part of the book explores why the modern covenant between science and humanism is disintegrating and what new deal might replace it in Dataism.

Homo Deus is available for loan at both the St. Joseph Twp. and Hilton libraries.

Recipe Corner

Winter Squash and Blue Cheese Galette

The slightly sweet taste of the squash, accented by the sharp blue cheese.... Mmmmmm

2 1/2 lb winter squash (butternut)
Olive oil
Salt and freshly ground pepper
1 small head of garlic, cloves separated but not peeled
1 small onion, finely chopped
10 fresh sage leaves, coarsely chopped (or 1 1/2 t dried)
1/2 c freshly grated parmesan or Romano cheese
2/3 cup crumbled Roquefort or other blue cheese

Pastry

1 large egg / beaten

Preheat the oven to 375. Using a large sharp knife, half the squash; scrape out and discard the seeds and fibers. Lightly brush each cut side of the squash with olive oil; season with salt and pepper. Place the garlic cloves in the cavities and turn the squash halves cut side down on a baking sheet. Bake for about 1 hour, or until the squash is tender when pierced with a knife. Remove the garlic and if the cloves aren't soft, return them to the oven and bake a little longer (The recipe can be made to this point up to 3 days ahead; wrap the squash and garlic separately and refrigerate.

Scoop out the squash flesh into a large bowl and mash with a fork until fairly smooth. (If the mashed squash is very wet, place it in a colander and let it drain for 2 hours.) Squeeze the garlic out of its skin and mash with a fork.

In a small skillet, warm 2 tsp of olive oil over low heat. Add the onion and sage and cook, stirring occasionally, until the onions are soft and beginning to colour, 6 to 7 minutes. Add to the squash along with the mashed garlic and Romano. Mix well, season with salt and pepper and fold in half of the Roquefort.

Preheat the oven to 400. On a lightly floured baking sheet without sides, roll out the galette dough into a 14 inch round. (or make small rounds for apps). Spread the squash filling over the dough, leaving a 2 inch border. Sprinkle the remaining Roquefort on top. Fold up and pleat the border of the dough. Brush the dough with the beaten egg.

Bake the galette until the crust is nicely browned - about 30 to 40 minutes.
