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Richards Landing Community Night Cancelled Again



For many it's probably not that big of a surprise to see that for the second year in a row Community Night in Richards Landing has officially been cancelled. There has been hope that at some point this summer things would be closer to normal, and the annual parade and festivities in Richards Landing is certainly one of the big staples that would bring normalcy back. However, because it's such a big event a lot of planning takes place that can't simply be done on a moment's notice, or just in case things improve ahead of schedule.

We talked to Barb Jackson, chair of the Richards Landing Community Night board. She calls the news "So frustrating," but given that we still can't

shop for nonessential goods, nor do we know for sure when outdoor gatherings will be allowed, the news is expected. While things are certainly trending in the right direction with vaccination rates up and case counts down, it's still probably going to be a while before big events can happen.

For those newer to the area, Community Night is the last Friday in July and draws crowds of approximately 1000+. Hilton Beach also hosts its own Community Night the following Saturday.

In a normal year, preparations would be well under way with permits needing to be applied for, recruiting the volunteers, signing up the other charitable organizations that sell food on the grounds, purchasing prizes, and all kinds of behind the scenes work that keeps one of the largest summer

events on the island running smooth.

The big loss will be the fundraising for Matthews Memorial Hospital, but Barb also mentions "It is also a blow to the other organizations who use the profits from their booths on Community Night who do so much for all of us here on our Island." Looking back at the last Richards Landing Community Night in 2019, the pie booth alone raised almost \$5000 for the hospital.

While frustrated by the cancellation, the board is now putting all their efforts into selling raffle tickets so the Hospital will still be able to get the equipment it needs. Much like last year, there is a quilt draw with a queen size handmade quilt, Mountain Bike and \$500.00 voucher. The draw will be held on July 30th. Last year's draw raised over \$4000 and with other donations totaling over \$11,600 which did actually slightly exceed the profits from 2019's Community Night, but even without asking we know they'd rather be planning for the night at the Centennial Grounds.

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Yet again the Ruby-Throated Hummingbirds are back well before most of the flowers are in bloom. After a few reports of sightings over the last week to 10 days or so quite a few have been hovering around our feeders.

The males have a ruby red throat where as the females are white. Even in black and white you can tell the difference between the two. A hummingbirds heart can beat up to 1260 beats per minute and take 250 breaths per minute. Given these numbers, it's no surprise their metabolism is so high and they are constantly feeding on flower nectar and at hummingbird feeders alike.

There has been some controversy about the typical red hummingbird food, which is available for purchase at many stores when open. While there are some groups suggesting the food is bad for the birds, the evidence is inconclusive at this time. However, if you are concerned (which the red dye they use has no benefits to the birds whatsoever and avoiding it is relatively simple) making sugar water to put into your feeders is very easy and cost effective: 4 parts water to 1 part white table sugar. Simply boil the water, add the sugar and stir until dissolved. Let it cool before placing it into the feeder and refill every 2-3 days, washing the feeder out once a week. Do not use honey, raw sugar, fruit juice, corn syrup or any other kinds of sweeteners.


