Algoma Trad Camp Kicks Off!



AND WHAT A START! Although camp activities began on Sunday night, the 2013 Algoma Trad Music and Dance Family Camp went public Monday night, with a concert by this year's supremely talented teaching performers – each of them a true star in their respective fields.

The teaching staff is a veritable 'Who's Who' of the Canadian traditional music scene, many of whom come from a long family line of melodic excellence, such as fiddlers Kelly Fitzgerald, Dan MacDonald and Pierre Schryer. Then, there are those who have adopted stage names for their act such as multi-instrumentalists Teilhard Frost and Sam Allison, better known as Sheesham and Lotus, who performed on the Island two years ago and dazzled us with their amazing talent and

ingenuity. There's also the so-gifted husband and wife team of Mark Roberts and Andrea Cooper, both of whom excel in the flute, tin whistle and 5 string banjo.

No Algoma Trad camp would be complete without veteran fiddler and sound engineer James Stephens, upon whom everyone seems to depend. And we haven't yet begun! The two hour concert included performances by every conceivable combination of performers and instruments, many of which were centred around amazing bassist Joe Phillips and equally-amazing guitarist Andy Hillhouse, perhaps best known, to us at least, as the Pierre Schryer Band. Oh, and let's not forget Pierre's wife Merrie, who happens to be principal trumpet for the Thunder Bay Symphony, just to name one of





THE WOMEN'S INSTITUTE'S 25TH ANNIVERSARY QUILT SHOW and Sale on August 2, 3 & 4 at the St. Joseph Island Central School in Richards Landing was one of our best shows. There were over 355 visitors through the doors who viewed 171 quilts, wall hangings, table covers & runners, purses and jackets.

Native Artist Naomi Smith of "Black Tulip Designs" did a Native Strawberry Emery Pin-cushion Workshop on Friday. She shared her knowledge and her passion, introducing the art of native beading. Her display at the entrance held examples of native beaded work that were over a hundred years old.

Norah McGuire-MacLeod of "Sew Little Time" ran workshops on Saturday & Sunday called Strip Tubing. Participants went home eager to complete their project after learning techniques to make a complicated looking quilt block with a special triangular ruler. Norah's instructional skills are exceptional and she ensures that every single student goes away with a sense of accomplishment.

Vendors "Life's a Stitch", "Sew Little Time", Maudie's Cottage", "Black Tulip Designs"


and "Why Knot Knit" offered visitors an opportunity to see and buy the latest in fabrics, patterns, machines, gizmos & gadgets, yarns, beads and jewelry. Special Thanks to "Life's a Stitch" for once again allowing quilters to drop off and pick up items for the show at their store on Queen Street in the Sault. This year they collected 71 items.

Quilter Extraordinaire Carol Sawchyn demonstrated hand quilting on her 1812 "Cot to Coffin" quilt. She had several items in the show and she always amazes me with her creativity and willingness to share ideas and techniques. Thanks Carol for helping to make our 25th a success.

There were several quilts on display that were in the first-ever quilt show. Thanks to the St. Joseph Island Museum for lending us quilts kept in their loving care. These include signature quilts that attract lots of attention as visitors search for relatives' names among the quilt blocks.

For the past several years the WI Quilt Show has prompted sales of quilted items. There are very few venues for local quilters to sell their works and the show offers that opportunity. Among several items sold during the show was Janet E. Johnson's lovely queen size quilt,





which was made scant days before the show, and long-arm quilted by Shawna DePlonty's "Aba Daba Quilts" in the Sault. Janet plans to donate the proceeds to Matthews Memorial Hospital Auxiliary!

Bonnie Sharpe was voted Viewer's Choice with her machine-embroidered/appliqued quilt named "Pictogram Block Party" quilted by Nicole Tull's Longarm Quilting Services "Quilting on Superior."

Graham Shell donated a unique set of maple leaf wood coasters for one of the door prizes, which was won by Michelle Tulloch. Maureen Sguigna won the St. Joseph Island Community Quilters Lap Quilt.

Karen Doyle donated a batik collection in earth tones of table runner, table topper, trivet and hot pads won by Marie McCulligh.

St. Joseph Island Real Estate Report

According to statistics reported from the Sault Ste. Marie Real Estate Board, sales on the island were down 52 per cent for the first 6 months of 2013 compared to the same time period in 2012.

2013 saw total sales volume of \$2,248,900 which included 11 residential sales and 7 vacant land sales, whereas in 2012 total volume was \$4,714,300 including 23 residential sales, 7 vacant land sales and 2 commercial units.

Breakdown of residential sales in 2013 showed that 6 sales were in the \$100,000 to \$200,000 range, 2 were below \$100,000 and 3 were between \$200,000 and \$300,000.

Residential sales in 2012 showed 11 of the 23 units were in the \$100,000 to \$200,000 range with 4 below \$100,000 and 8 between \$200,000 and \$300,000.

The long winter and cool spring as well as contract negotiations at Essar, the strong Canadian Dollar and high gas prices were probably factors in reduced activity for the first half of 2013.

After such a slow start to the year the market seems to be improving with 8 residential and 1 vacant land sales for July 2013 with 4 residential sales between \$100,000 and \$200,000, 1 sale below \$100,000 and 3 sales between \$200,000 and \$250,000.

RECIPE CORNER



To Die for Blueberry Muffins

- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup white sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1 egg
- 1/3 cup milk
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup butter, cub
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

Preheat oven to 400° F. Grease muffin cups or line with muffin liners. Combine 1 1/2 cups flour, 3/4 cup sugar, salt and baking powder. Place vegetable oil into a 1 cup measuring cup; add the egg and enough milk to fill the cup. Mix this with flour mixture. Fold in blueberries. Fill muffin cups right to the top, and sprinkle with crumb topping mixture.

Crumb Topping: Mix together 1/2 cup sugar, 1/3 cup flour, 1/4 cup butter, and 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon. Mix with fork, and sprinkle over muffins before baking.

Bake for 20 to 25 minutes in the preheated oven, or until done.

A Little Island History

With apologies to the St. Joseph Island Historical Society

IT'S INTERESTING what you can sometimes find when rooting around through old files. We thank our friend Teresa Parker, who came across a treatise on the background of several Island locations and sites, some of which was previously published in the Island Clippings, years ago.

Here are a couple:

Caradoc Point; Source: Mrs. Eleanor Adcock

Located on east side of St. Joseph Island, Caradoc Point is on the south side of Mosquito Bay where the land juts out into Lake Huron from the southeast end of St. Joseph Island.

According to the Grolier Encyclopedia, "Caractacus, or more correctly, Caratacus is a Latinized form of the Celtic Caradoc, which occurs in Welsh place names and was the name of one of the Knights of the Round Table." Since Major William Kingdom Rains named nearby Milford Haven and Tenby Bay after places in his homeland, Wales, it seems reasonable to assume that he also named Caradoc Point.

Jocelyn; Source: Glyn Smith papers in museum

A need arose for the naming of another post office on the Island. Christopher Young was one of a collective of local residents who couldn't decide what to name it. There was talk of using another local family's last name but it was discovered that the name was in use elsewhere. The federal post office sent him a list of English names and asked him to select one. He chose Jocelyn. The township was later named Jocelyn as well.
