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The Avro Arrow Re-Appears!

A LITTLE-KNOWN REPLICA of a giant in Canadian aviation history came out of hiding for a while last weekend. A 26 metre (85 feet) long life-sized copy of the famed Avro Arrow was moved to its temporary new home at the International Centre in Mississauga – formerly the site of the Avro (Canada) factory on Airport Road where its namesake, the legendary Avro Arrow was born.

Unlike its historic ancestor, this particular Arrow will never taste the sky, but it's likely to live a lot longer! The original Arrow was cancelled during flight trials in 1959, in a highly controversial decision by the Diefenbaker government – a decision that still ignites smoldering anger in military and aviation circles more than 60 years later.

At the time, it seemed that someone somewhere wanted the Arrow not only cancelled and scrapped, but even the tiniest thing having anything to do with it was hunted down and stamped out like a malevolent disease. Every aspect of the project, right down to flight models and engineering diagrams were relentlessly destroyed. The Arrow was dead and gone.

But not forgotten! Decades later, in 1998, a determined group of volunteers that included war veterans and aviation industry retirees set to work re-creating the scrapped aircraft, which was made doubly difficult by the absence of any detailed drawings or schematics.

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The full scale model was completed in 2006 and stood proudly on display at the Canadian Air & Space Museum at Downsview Park. Even then, it wasn't safe. In September, 2011 the Museum was told to find a new home, to make way for an ice rink complex, banishing the replica Arrow to a storage facility near Toronto's Lester B. Pearson airport.

But first, it will shine as the centrepiece display for the SME Canadian Manufacturing Technology Show, which runs at the International Centre from September 30th to October 4, before once again disappearing from public view ...at least until a new home is found.

Its move to the International Centre wasn't far – a mere 18 kilometres 'as the Arrow flies.' But THIS Arrow wasn't airborne. It was moved by three trailers in tandem, escorted by police vehicles in the wee hours between midnight and 4 am Monday. Although most of the airplane remained intact for the painfully slow and careful trip, its wingtips, nose gear and rocket pod were temporarily removed for reinstallation afterwards.

The route was also anything but straight; in fact it detoured as far north as Highway 7 to avoid low bridges and tight turns, taking over 40 kilometres to go that 'short' 18 km distance.

For many onlookers, it was eerily similar to watching NASA's Space Shuttle Endeavour travelling through the streets of Los Angeles to its new home in 2012. And for those who remembered the "real thing" here in Canada, the memories it invoked were both wistful and bitter.

Designated the CF-105 by the Royal Canadian Air Force, the Arrow was designed in the depths of the Cold War as a long distance, high altitude supersonic interceptor capable of shooting down the Soviets' best bombers. With its advanced delta wing design, state of the art avionics and weapons systems and its twin Iroquois engines pushing its two man crew to more than Mach 3 (3 times the speed of sound) the revolutionary plane was definitely a 'game changer'... but with costs rising to \$5 million per plane, the aircraft was also definitely expensive, especially in comparison to other front line fighters or interceptors of the time.

Although recognized as being decades ahead of its time, the longevity of the Arrow was endangered by other technological advances: future air wars would be fought not with or against long range manned bombers, but rather with unmanned guided missiles. Only five airworthy CF-105s were actually completed, while Number 6 was reported as 93% completed when the government's "kill" order came down.



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Avro was instructed to not just immediately halt all work, but to destroy all prototypes, models, drawings and plans. 14,000 people lost their jobs which lead to what became known as the 'Brain Drain', as NASA and American aircraft manufacturers lured key Avro personnel away to work on things like Space Shuttles, advanced fighter and stealth aircraft as well as commercial supersonic aircraft like the SST and the Concorde.

Almost every Canadian over the age of 60 remembers the Avro Arrow and its controversial death. To this day, many have ironclad opinions about what they believe to be the *real* factors and causes of the Arrow's demise.

To them, it wasn't just a promising concept that was killed, it was a revolutionary, distinctly Canadian creation that set the standard in advanced aircraft performance for decades to come. And it wasn't just 'killed' ... it was murdered.

IT'S TIME FOR FIRE PREVENTION WEEK, and from October 6 - 12, Hilton Union Fire and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) would like to remind local residents to 'Prevent Kitchen Fires.' During this year's fire safety campaign, fire departments will be spreading the word about the dangers of kitchen fires—most of which result from unattended cooking—and teaching local residents how to prevent kitchen fires from starting in the first place.

According to the latest NFPA research, cooking is the leading cause of home fires. Two of every five home fires begin in the kitchen—more than any other place in the home. Cooking fires are also the leading cause of home fire-related injuries.

It only takes a few minutes for a fire to start due to unattended cooking, which can then quickly spread. We hope that Fire Prevention Week will help us spread the message of safe cooking practices.

Among the safety tips that we would like emphasize:

- Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling, broiling, or boiling food.
- If you must leave the room, even for a short period of



time, turn off the stove.

- When you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, stay in the home, and use a timer to remind you.
- If you have young children, use the stove's back burners whenever possible. Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the stove.

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


