9 Volt Batteries – A Hidden Fire Hazard

EVERY HOMEOWNER KNOWS that properly-working smoke detectors can save lives and property by sounding a warning of danger from smoke and fire. Many also know that they should change the batteries in their detectors regularly, to keep them in top working condition. And still others take extra care to ensure that their batteries are properly disposed of, in an environmentally responsible manner.

But did you know that those 9 Volt batteries in your recycling bins or garbage bags can be a lethal fire hazard?

All it takes is for the battery's terminals to come into contact with another electrically-conducting object that could cause a short-circuit and you could have the beginnings of an electrical fire. Even 'dead' batteries can still have a residual electric charge remaining.

There's a safe way to dispose of these batteries: cover the terminal ends with a piece of electrical tape so if they do touch something, it won't create a dangerous 'short'.

So if you're storing old 9 Volt batteries for recycling or just throwing them in the garbage, take a few minutes to take them out and tape up those terminals to prevent a fire in your home, or even in the recycling depot or landfill.

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
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Group Health Centre's EPIC medical records system goes live


EPIC is a world-class system that provides the tools and resources for Group Health Centre physicians, partners and support staff to deliver the best possible care to the 71,000 Sault and area residents they serve.

EPIC is a huge upgrade from Group Health Centre's former electronic medical records software, and is a big change for everyone who will interface with it. While the GHC staff has been training on EPIC for months, there is an incredible amount to learn.

Until everyone has had a few weeks to get used to the system, patients and visitors to the Centre may experience longer than normal wait times. In order to help staff during the transition, they ask that patients and visitors:

Have their health card ready when calling or coming in for an appointment. Bring any current medications (in their original containers) to their next appointment.



Shipping Channel Ice Breaking Underway

THE US COAST GUARD has announced that one of its vessels will be breaking ice on the St. Mary's river from February 25th through March 1st, to allow passage for a tanker ship. The ice breaking will extend from Sault Ste Marie down to Detour Reef Light via the Middle Neebish Channel.

The U.S. Coast Guard Cutter involved will be the Katmai Bay, based in Sault Ste Marie, Michigan.

Snowmobilers, ATV riders and other recreational users of the ice should avoid any proximity to the shipping channels, plan their activity carefully, and use caution near the ice. The Coast Guard also strongly advises all ice fishermen to remove their ice shacks from areas close to the shipping channels.
