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## Sault MPP David Oraziotti Changes Jobs

IN PREMIER KATHLEEN WYNNE'S CABINET SHUFFLE announced Tuesday, Sault MPP David Oraziotti will leave the Ministry of Natural Resources Portfolio to take up the post of Minister of Government and Consumer Services in the new Liberal government.

Although apparently excluded from the Premier's official release, Premier Wynne did confirm his appointment via Twitter shortly afterwards.

Mr. Oraziotti was re-elected to his fourth straight term as the Sault's MPP.

The Premier offers a brighter future for Ontarians as her new majority government sorts itself out and gets down to work. "I am grateful for the trust the people of this province have placed in our government. We will work hard every day to build Ontario up, to create new opportunities for people and to ensure a more secure future," she said.

Premier Wynne and her cabinet team were sworn in on Tuesday during a ceremony at Queen's Park. In her Media Release following the ceremony, the Premier announced several sweeping changes in her key personnel.

Charles Sousa returns as Minister of Finance. His primary focus will be balancing the budget by 2017-18. Mitzie Hunter will step into a newly created role as Associate Minister of Finance, responsible for the Ontario Retirement Pension Plan.

As Minister of Economic Development, Employment and Infrastructure, Brad Duguid will work to ensure Ontario businesses can grow and create well-paying jobs that people can count on. He will also focus on investing in infrastructure, as it is integral to supporting economic prosperity.



Reza Moridi becomes Minister of Training, Colleges and Universities and Minister of Research and Innovation. In these roles, he will ensure that the skills of Ontario's workforce match the needs of employers today and the economy of tomorrow.

Building new transit, highways, roads and bridges is a key part of the government's plan to address congestion, connect people with jobs and get goods to market faster. Steven Del Duca becomes Minister of Transportation.

Glen Murray becomes Minister of the Environment and Climate Change, an expanded portfolio that will ensure Ontario can protect the gains it has made in fighting climate change, lead Ontario's mitigation and adaptation efforts to extreme weather and

strengthen its position as a leader in clean technology.

Liz Sandals returns as Minister of Education.

Perhaps the most dramatic move lies in the health care field, as noted medical authority Dr. Eric Hoskins becomes Minister of Health and Long-Term Care. Dipika Damerla becomes Associate Minister of Health responsible for Long-Term Care and Wellness.

Deb Matthews will take on the new role of President of the Treasury Board and will also continue to serve as Deputy Premier.

The Release also assures us that the Premier and her team will immediately put into action the government's plan to create opportunity and foster a more secure future for every person in the province.

Good luck to them ... and to all of us ... in getting our Province's critical needs under control.



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
# Rain Gardens: A Fun and Beautiful Way to Conserve Water

## Why Rain Gardens?

In nature, rainwater soaks into the soil where it is taken up and filtered by plants, replenishes groundwater supplies, and enters surface waters for use by humans and natural ecosystems. The way we have designed and built our communities disrupts this natural flow, which can affect ground and surface water replenishment in many areas. Additionally, impermeable yards, roofs, sidewalks, roads and parking lots allow for toxins, such as oil, gasoline, pesticides and other chemicals to be carried directly into nearby streams, rivers and lakes without being filtered.

A rain garden is a special kind of garden designed to manage storm water. They are formed from a shallow depression of soil that is planted with native perennial plants. Together the plants and soil in the garden absorb rain and storm water runoff from your yard, roof, or driveway to filter out pollutants.



## How can I start a Rain Garden?

A rain garden is relatively easy to create and care for, and even a small garden can go a long way in preventing pollution of nearby water resources. Some key things to think about are:

**Location:** Your rain garden should be in a spot where water naturally flows towards. It is often a good idea to place a garden down slope at least 10 feet away from your foundation to avoid basement flooding.

**Soil:** Soil characteristics such as pH, drainage and fertility vary from area to area. The ideal soil composition is 50-60% sand with equal parts topsoil (no clay) and compost (20-30% each).

**Drainage:** Dig a hole that is about 20 cm x 20 cm, and pour a bucket of water into it to test drainage capabilities. Ideally, the water will drain at a rate of 2.5 cm per hour. If it takes longer than the soil should be enriched or replaced before starting your garden.

**Size:** The goal of a rain garden is to absorb all the rain that would normally flow away from your yard. A simple way to

calculate your garden size is to multiply the width of your roof by the length of your roof to get the square footage. Do the same for paved areas. For sandy soils, rain Gardens should be 20-30% of the size of the roof, patio or pavement draining into it. For soils higher in clay, your rain garden should be 60% of the size. Remember even the smallest garden counts!

**Design:** The bottom of the garden should be saucer shaped so that rainwater can spread out as it goes through the soil. Remove the soil and pile it to the side of your garden. A reservoir of gravel or tiles on the bottom of the bed will keep the garden from becoming waterlogged. Use a pitch fork to dig and loosen the pile of earth you have removed. Mix compost in with the soil if you wish to enhance the soil. Scoop the loosened soil back into the garden a few scoops at a time.

**Vegetation:** Select native plants you love that will brighten up your property. Native plants often have deeper roots, attract beneficial native insects and wildlife, and are already adapted to the weather and climate patterns in your area! For a great list of suggestions check out:

**Plant:** Perennials are often bought potted. Loosen the plant inside the pot and slide it out gently. Pull from the base of the plant to avoid breakage. Lightly shake the plant to remove soil from the roots. Place your plant in the soil at the same level it was growing in the pot, and gently pat soil around it. Water the plants well and apply mulch, if desired.

Rain gardens not only prevent pollution and protect groundwater, they are meant to be beautiful additions to your home. You will soon notice that your rain gardens bring new songbirds, butterflies, colors, fragrances and sounds that will liven up your yard and brighten your day



### **How to maintain strong bones**

WHEN WE'RE YOUNGER, bones are strong, especially if we're active. But as we age, bones begin to thin, especially in postmenopausal women. This makes halting bone loss important.

One of the best ways to do this is with diet—eat the right foods and we can increase bone density. Calcium is the cornerstone of strong bones. A woman at age 51 or older or a man at age 71 or older needs about 1200 mg per day. Milk is a great way to get that calcium. An 8-ounce cup of milk is 300 mg. If you're not a milk drinker, 1 cup of yogurt has the same amount of calcium. Yogurt is an excellent source for people who are lactose intolerant as it is low in lactose. Most lactose intolerant individuals can eat hard cheeses without any difficulty.

Two types of fish high in calcium are sardines and salmon. The bones in those fish, which are edible, contain bone-boosting calcium. Plus they also contain vitamin D (helps calcium absorption in the body), and omega-3 fatty acids (decrease inflammation).

This may be surprising but vegetables are high in calcium. Dark green leafy veggies are best, like bok choy, kale, and collard and turnip greens. One cup of chopped, cooked turnip greens has about 200 milligrams of calcium.

Even though we don't get sunshine in the diet, it is essential

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
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for calcium absorption. The body produces vitamin D when exposed to sunlight and it is this vitamin D that allows us to absorb calcium. Living in the north (like we do), and cloudy weather can interfere with this exposure. In addition, it is recommended by dermatologists to limit our sunlight exposure due to the potential harmful effects of ultraviolet rays. So many people choose to take a vitamin D supplement. The recommended dietary intake is 600 iu (international units) a day for most adults, jumping to 800 iu after age 70.

Diet can be one of your best lines of defense against osteoporosis. So eat well and keep your bones strong.
