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A Summer Saturday in the Landing



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BRDHC Receives Highest Accreditation Ranking

IN EARLY JUNE, the Blind River District Health Centre Corporation received the distinction of “Accredited with Exemplary Standing” – the highest ranking issued by Accreditation Canada under its Qmentum program. The Blind River, Thessalon, and Matthews Memorial hospital sites all participated in this rigorous survey.

“We’re standing proud!” says Gaston Lavigne, Chief Executive Officer. “In the past we’ve always had excellent results, however this is the first time we’ve received the highest commendation. Everyone in the organization – staff, physicians, volunteers, and board members – has truly dedicated himself and herself to providing exceptional safe and quality patient care. Clearly we’re seeing the results of that work.”

According to Accreditation Canada “Health care accreditation contributes to quality improvement and patient safety by enabling a health organization to regularly and consistently assess and improve its services.” Organizations in good standing typically go through this evaluation process once every four years. There are four possible decisions:

- Not accredited
- Accredited
- Accredited with Commendation
- Accredited with Exemplary Standing

Independent health experts are brought in to perform a meticulous evaluation of the hospital sites, examining all



facets including leadership, governance, clinical services, and patient safety, just to name a few. In total, BRDHC was measured against 1,383 applicable standards, and met 1,369 – a success rate of 99%! All 45 Required Organizational Practices – or “must have” practices – were fully met.

The Accreditation Canada surveyor report highlighted BRDHC’s commitment to integration and its engagement with the Thessalon and Matthews Memorial hospital sites. The report further detailed evidence of BRDHC’s openness, collaboration and commitment to its community partners. “In a rural setting, strong relationships are almost essential for success.” says

Lavigne. “We’re very pleased that our commitment to our partners is evident and was reflected in our results.”

BRDHC has been accredited for a four-year period. The next evaluation cycle will take place in 2018.



Our Island Roads Can be Dangerous! Please be Careful!

WITH THE RETURN OF THE SUMMER driving season, the Island Clippings has been receiving a steady stream of accident or 'close call' reports, accompanied by requests to remind everyone that even our open, uncongested island roads can be a dangerous place for the unwary or the uncaring.



Perhaps we can all benefit from a reminder once in a while.

We know how easy it can be to let our guard down in our comparatively light traffic and let our speed build up on our open rural roads. But the road isn't necessarily as "open" as it appears. In fact, the odds are that you're simply not noticing the wildlife that's just out of sight, like the deer with her fawn or the nesting turtles that are almost invisible – until they appear right in front of you with no warning.

Often, that 'open road' can be a traffic accident that's just waiting for one key ingredient to come along: you.

Domestic animals can also be a roadside danger. People walking their dogs or riding on horseback are a frequent and heartwarming sight, but every creature is unpredictable and likely to react fearfully. Be sure to slow down when you encounter them, and give them a wide berth when you pass.

Our rural roads are also frequented by cyclists and slow-moving farm equipment like tractors, sometimes towing a trailer. Again, please slow down and share the road. Pick the right time to safely pass, giving them and yourself lots of room. And if you should come across another vehicle that's stopped or slowed on the road, ask yourself if there's a reason for that. Perhaps they're stopped for something you haven't seen yet, like that deer, or perhaps they're in need of a helping hand. Don't just rocket past them!

Perhaps the best precaution is simply to take just a moment to ask yourself, "Am I really in THAT much of a hurry?"



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Managing your Money

Making the Perfect Cottage Pass

In sports, a perfect pass is a thing of beauty. Your cottage is also a thing of beauty – a place for fun times with the people you love. But at some point, you will want to pass your cottage on to others, probably your adult children. To help you avoid potential obstacles like excessive taxation and maybe even some surprising opposition, here's how to make the perfect cottage pass and ensure it will stay in the family for a long time to come.

Don't get blindsided. Wayne Gretzky famously said that he skates to where the puck is going to be, not where it has been. When you're thinking about who to pass your cottage to, do you rely on what has been or do you consider what is going to happen? For instance, your adult children have always enjoyed the cottage – but will they in the future when you're no longer around? Talk to your children now and if there are those who do not want ownership responsibilities, you can help avoid future family squabbles by ensuring they are treated fairly in your will.

Make the easy pass. Plan now to avoid excessive tax liabilities when you make the pass. Unless you're passing assets to a spouse or common-law partner, when you die you're deemed to have disposed of your capital assets at fair market value – meaning that if your cottage property has appreciated, your heirs could face a significant capital gains penalty.

A less-taxing pass: Transfer the property to your kids while you are alive, either as an outright gift or by selling it to them at fair market value. (Selling for less can result in double taxation.) Spread out the capital gains triggered by the sale by making the payments over a five year period and claiming the capital gains reserve, so that only 20% of the capital gain is taxable in any one year.

Alternatively, transfer the property as a trust, with your kids as beneficiaries. This transfer option will also trigger an immediate capital gain but future capital gains on the property will accrue to your children and are not payable until they sell the property.

Insure your pass. Cover cottage capital gains – and other estate debts – with permanent life insurance. The death benefits are usually tax-free and can provide an essential source of cash to pay any taxes so your family won't be forced to sell assets, such as your cottage.

The perfect cottage pass should be an essential part of your overall financial and estate game plan. Your professional fi-




Thomas Henshell's Spectacular St. Joseph Island Brownie Sundae

One of my favorite brownie sundaes is made at Canyon Creek, a restaurant chain in Toronto. Save a trip and enjoy the summer with this treat for the family.

4 Island Market brownies

16 tbsp. (60g) Gay Lea spray whipping cream

2 tbsp. Smucker's squeeze microwavable caramel sauce

2 cups Chapman vanilla ice cream

Prep time: 5 minutes. Makes 4 servings

1. Cut each brownie lengthwise into 4 long strips. Then chop so you have medium diced brownie bits (about 0.5 inch cubes)
2. Microwave caramel sauce according to directions, about 45 seconds.
3. Scoop ice cream into bowls
4. Sprinkle about a brownie's worth on top of each bowl of ice cream
5. Spray whip cream in circle on top of brownie bits
6. With heated caramel sauce slightly cooled, trace very light thin lines across entire bowl. Rotate bowl 90 degrees, and repeat, to make a grid pattern
7. Enjoy!

Tip: The caramel sauce enhances the overall flavor of the ice cream and brownie, whereas chocolate sauce overpowers and draws away from it.
