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## St. Joe Takes a Licking ... But Keeps on Ticking!

IS THERE ANYONE ON THE ISLAND who has NOT heard about last Thursday's snap wind storm, or not been affected by it? It's been the #1 topic of conversation everywhere, with all of the reports and stories about trees down, homes, garages, decks, sheds and vehicles being damaged, docks blown away, power outages, telephone service down, and so on.

Thankfully, we think that the most important topic of all is that, to our knowledge, there were no storm-related injuries reported, although we have heard some sad reports of lost pets.

Our off-island readers might not yet know that parts of Central Algoma from Echo Bay to Desbarats – and especially St.

Joseph Island - were hit by a powerful wind storm Thursday afternoon at about 4 pm. Hydro Power lines and transformers were knocked down in some parts of the Island, with power not being restored in some areas until the next day. Michigan's Upper Peninsula was also a victim, with many areas not getting power restored for 3 days. As of our press time, several Island residents are still without telephone service.

Some reports have described the phenomenon as a "Microburst" – a sudden, vicious downdraft of air, usually associated with a powerful thunderstorm that, upon hitting ground level, spreads out in every direction. These downbursts don't rotate or spin like a tornado, but can be just as

deadly. They usually last for relatively short periods of time - just a couple of seconds, up to several minutes. Although usually short-lived, Microbursts can be very, very nasty. Their wind velocity and strength can easily topple fully-grown large trees - which we've now seen - and have even caused several fatal airplane crashes over the years, literally pushing an aircraft down into the ground.

This one slammed into the Island shortly after 4 pm, hammering us with sustained winds near 60 km/h, and wind gusts of up to 100 km/h for about 45 minutes before moving on and eventually dissipating. For some residents, the wind storm was merely an inconvenience, doing little damage, while others had to deal with seeing their homes and property damaged, and many had to spend a dark night with their homes lit only by candles, oil lamps or generators. For many rural homes, the lost power also meant the loss of their water pumps, making them unable to draw water from their taps, or even flush their toilets.

Crews from Algoma Power were everywhere over the weekend, working like bees to replace damaged transformers, some of which had been blown right off their poles, or re-stringing entire sections of fried power lines, like those in the Sailors' Encampment area. Algoma Power certainly faced many challenges and their crews rose to meet those challenges, in some areas working around the clock to restore power.

We've all been seeing and hearing about this storm's legacy. One couple from the southern United States decided to cancel their holiday and fly home after their vehicle, which was 'safely' parked outside their camp, was crushed by a falling tree. Another family was stranded in their own home when several fallen trees completely blocked their driveway, narrowly missing their house and shed. We also felt particularly sorry for some in-town residents who, unlike rural residents, lost the one and only tree on their property.

Yet we've also heard uplifting stories of caring Islanders who selflessly came to the aid of their neighbours, chainsaw in hand or with tractors and chains, working hard to clean up

the damage and helping to get things back to normal ... and asking nothing in return. Such people are the true heroes of stories like this. While 'random acts of kindness' have become a welcome and popular fad in recent months, these people have always just lived that way. Folks simply help other folks out, that's all.

Visiting Kentvale on Saturday to buy more oil for his own famous chainsaw, the City Boy was not in the least surprised to learn that sales of chainsaw-related supplies had been perhaps a little 'brisker' than usual for this time of year.

Yet that's not all. We also heard several reports of storm surges or 'Seiches' caused by high sustained winds that literally push the water level up at one end of the lake, while



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the water level drops accordingly at the opposite end. Although we have not substantiated the claims, some lakefront residents reported the wind pushing the water higher up their beach by over 20 feet, damaging or washing away docks and shorefront furniture. Also unconfirmed and hopefully greatly exaggerated in the telling, are a few tragic instances of people's pets being carried off by the re-surg-ing water.

Ace Island Clippings reporter Teresa Parker also tells us that elsewhere, this relentless wind and water event pushed a 1000 foot freighter, fully loaded with a heavy cargo of iron ore, onto a sand bar in the Straits near Mackinaw Island. Now that's a powerful push! The ship was eventually re-floated, but only after off-loading some of its cargo.

All in all, the Island has met this weather challenge and has shaken off the blow. But there's also a strong lesson and a warning here for all of us: be prepared for an emergency! Next time – and there WILL be a next time - we might not be so lucky.

Joe Books, the Island's Emergency Services Coordinator, reminds us that every household should be prepared to get by for at least 72 hours without outside assistance, in the event of a serious occurrence or an outright disaster.

Make an Emergency Plan for your family. Think about emergency contact information for other relatives and establish a meeting place for family members who might have become separated. If you don't already have one, start now to assemble a basic Emergency Kit. At very least, it should contain at least 2 litres of water per person per day, canned or dried food and sealed energy bars. And don't forget a non-electric can opener!

You should also have a good first aid kit, a hand-cranked or battery-powered radio, flashlights and don't forget to have a supply of fresh batteries on hand! Think too about some emergency cash, a copy of your Emergency contact list and special items like prescription medications, infant care needs and don't forget your pets! Ideally, each member of your family should know basic CPR and first aid. It could save a life in an emergency, until help can reach you.

## Ontario Approves Extended Use of Studded Snow Tires.

The Ontario Ministry of Transportation has announced that it has extended the period in which Northern Ontario drivers may use studded snow tires.

Studded snow tires offer greatly-improved traction and handling on wet, icy roads in winter, thereby improving driving safety. Their use was previously allowed from October 1st until April 30th. The new regulation, based on a recommendation by the Ontario Provincial Police, allows their use from September 1 through May 31st, providing the vehicle is registered to an owner living in Northern Ontario. They can also be used by an out-of-province vehicle travelling in Ontario for less than a month.

The regulation stipulates that only lightweight, Scandinavian studs may be used, in order to reduce the damage done by studded tires to our road surfaces.

Somehow, with our flowers in bloom, temperatures in the '20s, our leaves not yet changing and boats and people still in the water, the thought of having snow tires, studded or not, on our cars already just doesn't seem to belong! But you never know ....



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
