Aside from putting on a fun and frolic-full night of entertainment, Comedy Night's "business objective" was to raise funds for the seniors' services offered by the Dr. Harold S. Trefry Memorial Centre.

It's no secret that the critical need for the centre's seniors' programs is growing every day as the aging post-war "Baby Boomers" swell the ranks of our senior population. While the need is growing, actual funding from the Province has been dwindling. Also, in many cases, awareness of the services available and "caregiver burnout" have lead to those services being utilized earlier-on, before the need becomes serious and long-term care is sought.



"This is a great thing," explains Program Coordinator Ruthie Stewart, "but growing demand, along with the current overgrowth has caused a forecasted deficit as of March 31st, the official year end for those services. This has sparked interaction with the municipalities of our currently serviced area, in an effort to address an interim funding shortage while expanded provincial funding is awaited."



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Ruthie adds that some municipalities have already stepped up to ensure that dollars are contributed to ensure service availability, and many other municipalities have promised to include interim funding in their budget deliberations for the coming year, all part of working together to keep quickly growing services afloat, while waiting for expanded funding.

'Comedy Night' is a popular way to help raise some of that badly-needed funding. "We all need to step up to do our part to ensure that service for seniors in our communities is not forgotten and that services are available, not only for our



dearly loved seniors but eventually for each one of us." says Ruthie. "Let's be sure we honour our senior residents, the ones who have made us what we are today— caring, loving and supportive communities."

And Friday's 'Comedy Night' was such a great, fun way to help do that!

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

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

Our campaign this year focuses on giving Canadians a “New Lease On Life”, and celebrating the 30th anniversary of the Purina® Walk for Dog Guides. Thanks to the sponsorship of Nestle Purina, all proceeds from the walk go directly to the raising and training of guide dogs.

The Lions Foundation of Canada trains Dog Guides and assists Canadians with a wide range of disabilities. With six programs in place, Canadians with disabilities are offered the opportunity to find greater independence, mobility and safety through the help of a Dog Guide.

**Canine Vision** for people who are blind or visually impaired

**Hearing Ear** for people who are deaf or hard of hearing

**Service** for people who have a physical disability

**Seizure Response** for people who have epilepsy

**Diabetic Alert** for people who have type 1 diabetes with hypoglycemic unawareness

**Autism Assistance** for children who have autism spectrum disorder

Depending on the program, Dog Guides are trained to perform a set of basic skills that are useful to all handlers. However, some of their training is also tailored to meet the specific needs of their future handler. In the final stage of training, the client and Dog Guide train and live together at the Oakville facility for two to four weeks. This helps to ensure that the new working team develops a bond and prepares them for their next step - returning home.

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## “A Day Out”

THE DR. HAROLD S. TREFRY has been granted approval to begin offering “Day Out” in a new location. Until recently, this provincially-funded program was being offered in Richards Landing and Bruce Mines.

The Richards Landing program has been quite popular, but for some reason the Bruce Mines program never really took off, with very small numbers attending.

The program will continue to be offered in Richards Landing on Thursdays and, starting in April, will be offered in Echo Bay on Wednesdays, where there is already a list of interested participants.

The “Day Out” program is very social. The program on the Island has grown, with the laughter and fun-filled atmosphere drawing in people from all walks of life to be part of the program. The day starts with a coffee component allowing attendees the opportunity to hear and share about the events of their own lives and the community. The rest of the day is filled with opportunities to learn or teach new skills, share jokes, participate in games and other activities and the heart and soul of the program—create and maintain new friendships, a band of people that often become like family.

Perhaps the most important thing this program does is to enable participants to give their 24-hour caregivers respite as the program allows caregivers who do not feel comfortable leaving loved ones suffering from a precarious health or mental condition alone, to have the freedom to do errands or go to their appointments, without worrying about their loved ones at home.

In doing so, this program helps to eliminate caregiver burnout, as can be witnessed by the tired, wrinkled, worried faces of caregivers dropping loved-ones off at the beginning of the day and the peace-filled expressions of caregivers after a day off. The wonderful thing about the program is that everyone leaves happier, perhaps due at least in part to the enthusiastic “Day Out” leader, Amanda Farquhar, who helps organize the program.

There is a small fee for the program, which includes coffee and muffins as well as lunch. The move to Echo Bay will not cost the Centre additional funds, but will instead meet needs of more people with current resources. When the Municipality of MacDonald, Meredith and Aberdeen heard about the merits of the program, they quickly agreed to make the Echo Bay Hall available for the program.


